A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ZERO-EMISSION VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that climate change 2 caused by greenhouse gas emissions from burning fossil fuels 3 poses a serious threat to the economic well-being, public health, natural resources, and environment of Hawaii. 4 The 5 potential adverse impacts of climate change include the exacerbation of air-quality problems, a reduction in the quality 6 7 and supply of water, a rise in sea levels resulting in the 8 displacement of coastal businesses and residences, damage to 9 marine ecosystems and the natural environment, and an increase 10 in incidents of infectious diseases, asthma, and other human 11 health-related problems.

12 The State has committed to eliminating imported fuels from 13 the electricity and ground transportation sectors and has also 14 committed to abiding by the Paris Climate Accord's goal to limit 15 the amount of global warming to less than 1.5 degrees Celsius. 16 The legislature finds that meeting the State's clean energy

1	goals and commitments necessitates the rapid transition to
2	vehicles that utilize local, renewable energy sources.
3	The legislature further finds that rental motor vehicles
4	represent the largest passenger vehicle fleets in Hawaii and are
5	responsible for a significant amount of carbon emissions.
6	Incorporating large numbers of zero-emission vehicles into
7	rental motor vehicle fleets would significantly reduce carbon
8	emissions, increase the number of zero-emission vehicles
9	entering the secondary market, making them more affordable to
10	more Hawaii residents, and demonstrate to all who visit the
11	State that Hawaii is a leader in clean energy and sustainable
12	transportation.
13	The purpose of this Act is to:
14	(1) Set requirements for rental motor vehicle lessors
15	operating in Hawaii, with more than two hundred light
16	duty passenger vehicles, to plan for incorporating
17	zero-emission vehicles in the lessors' fleets;
18	(2) Require each rental motor vehicle lessor operating in
19	Hawaii to report to the director of commerce and

3	(3) Establish a task force to develop a plan for
4	incorporating zero-emission vehicles into the fleets
5	of rental motor vehicle lessors pursuant to the
6	schedule established by this Act.
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 437D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
9	and to read as follows:
10	"§437D- Zero-emission vehicles. (a) Each lessor in the
11	State shall plan to incorporate zero-emission vehicles into the
12	lessor's fleet according to the following schedule:
13	(1) No less than ten per cent by July 1, 2026;
14	(2) No less than twenty-five per cent by July 1, 2028; and
15	(3) No less than fifty per cent by July 1, 2030.
16	(b) The requirements set forth in this section shall apply
17	only to lessors owning and operating, as rental motor vehicles,
	a total of more than two hundred light duty passenger vehicles

3	(c) To certify compliance with this section, beginning in
4	2021, each lessor in the State shall report to the director
5	annually by December 1, detailing the make, model, license plate
6	number, and fuel type of each rental motor vehicle in the
7	lessor's fleet.
8	(d) For the purposes of this section:
9	"Battery electric vehicle" means a vehicle with four or
10	more wheels that draws propulsion exclusively from a battery
11	that can be recharged from an external source of energy.
12	"Hydrogen fuel cell vehicle" means a vehicle with four or
13	more wheels that draws propulsion from electricity generated by
14	passing hydrogen through a fuel cell.
15	"Plug-in hybrid electric vehicle" means a vehicle with four
16	or more wheels that draws propulsion from a battery, but which
17	also has an internal combustion engine that may be used to
18	either propel the vehicle directly, or to produce electricity to
19	recharge the battery; provided that a plug-in hybrid electric
20	vehicle with sixteen or more kilowatt hours of battery storage
21	qualifies as a full zero-emission vehicle, while a plug-in





1	hybrid electric vehicle with less energy storage qualifies as a
2	partial zero-emission vehicle, to be calculated by dividing the
3	total kilowatt hours of energy storage in the battery by
4	sixteen, rounded to the nearest tenth.
5	"Zero-emission vehicle" means a battery electric vehicle, a
6	plug-in hybrid electric vehicle, or a hydrogen fuel cell
7	vehicle."
8	SECTION 3. (a) There is established within the department
9	of commerce and consumer affairs for administrative purposes a
10	task force to develop a plan for incorporating zero-emission
11	vehicles into the fleets of rental motor vehicle lessors
12	operating in Hawaii pursuant to the schedule established by
13	section 437- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.
14	(b) The task force shall consist of the following members:
15	(1) The director of commerce and consumer affairs or the
16	director's designee, who shall serve as the
17	chairperson of the task force;
18	(2) The director of business, economic development, and
19	tourism or the director's designee;
20	(3) The director of transportation or the director's
21	designee;

1	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the

Zero-emission Vehicles; Rental Motor Vehicles; Lessors; Appropriation

Description:

Requires rental motor vehicle lessors with more than two hundred light duty passenger vehicles, to plan for the incorporation of at least fifty per cent of zero-emission vehicles into the lessor's fleet by 2030 and report information on all vehicles in the lessor's fleet to the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Establishes a task force to develop a plan for incorporating zero-emission vehicles into the fleets of rental motor vehicle lessors operating in Hawaii. Appropriates funds for the task force. (SB2955 HD1)
