A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS TREATMENT COURT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
 to continue the third circuit's veterans treatment court, which
 is intended and designed to recognize and address the unique
 needs of veterans entering the criminal justice system.

5 The legislature finds that many veterans who enter the 6 criminal justice system suffer from mental illness and substance 7 abuse issues arising from their service to our country. The 8 Bureau of Justice Assistance found that eighty-one per cent of 9 all veterans involved in the justice system had a substance 10 abuse problem prior to incarceration, thirty-five per cent were 11 identified as suffering from alcohol dependency, twenty-three 12 per cent had been homeless in the prior year, and twenty-five 13 per cent were identified as mentally ill. The underlying cause 14 for the incarceration of many of these veterans was often post-15 traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, a substance 16 use disorder, or a combination of any of the three.



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1 The legislature further finds that veterans may be 2 apprehensive about communicating the need for help with 3 nonveterans and may need extra assistance in pursuing 4 eligibility for services offered by the Department of Veterans 5 Affairs. To address these concerns, the third circuit launched 6 a veterans treatment court for the island of Hawaii in November 7 2014 with funds from a federal grant. The veterans treatment 8 court helps to provide a combination of high level supervision, 9 mentoring, verification and monitoring of Veterans Affairs 10 services, incentives, consequences, motivation, and veteran-11 specific treatment planning that address the diverse needs of 12 veterans in the criminal justice system. However, the federal 13 grant expired at the end of September 2017. Therefore, funds 14 are necessary to continue the veterans treatment court on the 15 island of Hawaii.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize
additional positions and appropriate funding for the judiciary.
SECTION 2. (a) The judiciary may convert one temporary
social worker IV position into a full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
permanent social worker IV position and establish one additional
full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent social worker IV



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position to support the veterans treatment court in the third
 circuit.

3 (b) There is appropriated out of the general revenues of
4 the State of Hawaii the sum of \$105,912 or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to fund the positions
6 authorized in subsection (a).

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for8 the purposes of this Act.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 17-3
