### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 353-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§353-16 Transfer of committed felon to federal
- 4 institution. (a) The director may effect the transfer of  $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$
- 5 any committed felon incarcerated for a violent crime under
- 6 section 351-32 to any federal correctional institution for
- 7 imprisonment, subsistence, care, and proper employment of such a
- 8 felon.
- 9 (b) A committed felon incarcerated in an out-of-state
- 10 federal correctional institution for a crime that is not a
- 11 violent crime under section 351-32 shall be returned to Hawaii
- 12 no later than July 1, 2020."
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 353-16.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "§353-16.2 Transfer of inmates to out-of-state
- 16 institutions. (a) The director may effect the transfer of a
- 17 committed felon incarcerated for a violent crime under section

- 1 351-32 to any correctional institution located in another state
- 2 regardless of whether the state is a member of the Western
- 3 Interstate Corrections Compact; provided that the institution is
- 4 in compliance with appropriate health, safety, and sanitation
- 5 codes of the state, provides a level of program activity for the
- 6 inmate that is suitable, and is operated by that state  $[\tau]$  or by
- 7 any of its political subdivisions[, or by a private
- 8 institution]; and provided further that the transfer is either:
- 9 (1) In the interest of the security, management of the
- 10 correctional institution where the inmate is presently
- 11 placed, or the reduction of prison overcrowding; or
- 12 (2) In the interest of the inmate.
- 13 (b) Terms and conditions of the transfer and any
- 14 reimbursement for expenses shall be agreed upon between the
- 15 department and the out-of-state correctional institution prior
- 16 to transfer.
- 17 (c) A committed felon incarcerated in an out-of-state
- 18 correctional institution for a crime that is not a violent crime
- 19 under section 351-32 shall be returned to Hawaii no later than
- **20** July 1, 2020."

# S.B. NO. 2979

1 SECTION 3. Section 353-16.35, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the 4 governor, with the assistance of the director, may negotiate 5 with any person for the development or expansion of [private in-6 state correctional facilities or] public in-state turnkey 7 correctional facilities to reduce prison overcrowding; provided 8 that if an environmental assessment or environmental impact 9 statement is required for a proposed site or for the expansion 10 of an existing correctional facility under section 343-5, then 11 notwithstanding the time periods specified for public review and 12 comments under section 343-5, the governor shall accept public 13 comments for a period of sixty days following public 14 notification of either an environmental assessment or an 15 environmental impact statement." 16 SECTION 4. Section 353-16.36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **17** repealed. 18 ["[\$353-16.36] Contracts for construction of correctional 19 facilities by private entities. The governor may enter into and 20 execute contracts in the name of the State with any private 21 entity to construct and then lease or purchase correctional

# S.B. NO. 2979

### Report Title:

Corrections; Inmate Transfer; Out-of-State Correctional Institutions; Private Correctional Facilities

### Description:

Limits the Director of Public Safety's ability to transfer convicted felons to any federal correctional institution or a correctional institution in another state to only those felons incarcerated for violent crimes under HRS section 351-32. Requires that all felons incarcerated in an out-of-state correctional institution or an out-of-state federal correctional institution for a crime that is not a violent crime under HRS section 351-32 be returned to Hawaii no later than July 1, 2020. Repeals the Governor's authority to negotiate or contract for expansion or construction of private correctional facilities.
