A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that despite having a				
2	high school graduation rate of eighty-one per cent, only fifty-				
3	six per cent of Hawaii's public school graduates continued on to				
4	post-secondary education in 2015. The legislature further finds				
5	that high school students in Hawaii would benefit from precisely				
6	aligning curriculum to workforce readiness, which depends upon				
7	close collaboration between the public school system, a				
8	community college, and one or more industry employers near the				
9	school complex to ensure they receive the industry-based skills				
10	and certification required for employment after graduation and				
11	to live, learn, work, and play in the community.				
12	The legislature additionally finds that collaboration				
13	between educators and industry will enable students to graduate				
14	from high school with a high school diploma and an industry-				
15	recognized associate's degree. Students may also earn pre-				
16	apprenticeship certificates and other industry-recognized				
17	certificates in addition to an associate's degree. The				

- 1 legislature also finds that similar models recently established
- 2 in Connecticut, Illinois, and New York are showing promise in
- 3 graduating more high school students with career-ready skills to
- 4 meet an industry's workforce needs.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to establish a workforce
- 6 readiness program within the department of education.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 9 and to read as follows:
- 10 "§302A- Workforce readiness program; establishment. (a)
- 11 There is established within the department a workforce readiness
- 12 program.
- 13 (b) The department shall designate schools to participate
- 14 in the program.
- (c) Workforce readiness program schools shall:
- 16 (1) Include grades nine through twelve;
- 17 (2) Be schools with qualified courses under the dual
- 18 credit program established pursuant to section 302A-
- 19 401;
- 20 (3) Enable students to graduate with a high school diploma
- 21 and an industry-recognized associate's degree;

1	(4)	Give students opportunities to earn pre-apprenticeship		
2		certificates and other industry-recognized		
3		certificates in addition to an associate's degree; and		
4	(5)	Integrate high school courses, college courses, and		
5		certificate or license programs that are based on		
6		current and projected industry standards and focused		
7		on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics		
8		with mentoring, job shadowing, internships, pre-		
9		apprenticeship training, and other workplace education		
10		experiences throughout grades nine through twelve.		
11	(d)	The department shall coordinate with the University of		
12	<u>Hawaii an</u>	d the department of labor and industrial relations and		
13	enter int	o contracts with industry employers near the school		
14	complex a	s required to develop and implement the workforce		
15	readiness program.			
16	<u>(e)</u>	The department shall adopt rules in accordance with		
17	chapter 9	1 to carry out the purposes of this section."

Workforce Readiness School Program; Department of Education; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a Workforce Readiness Program within the Department of Education to allow students to graduate from an extended high school enrollment with a high school diploma and an industry-recognized associate's degree. Appropriates moneys to develop and implement the program. (SB298 HD2)

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
