A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. (a) There is established within the department
3	of business, economic development, and tourism, an alternative
4	energy research and development pilot program to provide grants
5	to qualified businesses conducting research and development in
6	alternative energy. The purpose of the pilot program shall be
7	to promote the research and development of alternative energy in
8	Hawaii by authorizing the Hawaii technology development
9	corporation to provide matching grants to businesses that meet
10	criteria established in subsection (b).
11	(b) Subject to the availability of funds, the Hawaii
12	technology development corporation may provide a grant to any
13	business that:
14	(1) Has been awarded a competitive contract from the
15	Department of Defense Office of Naval Research related
16	to the research of alternative energy and energy
17	efficiency technologies in the fields of geothermal.

1		solar, wind, ocean power, hydrodynamics, bioenergy,
2		biomass, solid waste, smart grids, transportation, or
3		demand response;
4	(2)	Is sixty per cent or more resident-owned. For
5		purposes of this paragraph, "resident" shall have the
6		same meaning as in section 235-1, Hawaii Revised
7		Statutes;
8	(3)	Is a for-profit entity organized under the laws of the
9		State;
10	(4)	Has been doing business in the State for no less than
11		one year;
12	(5)	Agrees to expend all grant funds, awarded pursuant to
13		this Act, in the State; and
14	(6)	Conducts research in alternative energy that has a
15		high technology readiness level or high potential for
16		implementation as evidenced by a contract, funded by
17		moneys designated by the United States Congress as
18		funding for alternative energy and a national defense
19		budget funding directive, with the Department of
20		Defense Office of Naval Research that is existing and

1	active or was granted within three years prior to the
2	effective date of this Act;
3	provided that the amount of any grant awarded pursuant to this
4	Act shall not exceed fifty per cent of the amount of the grant
5	awarded to the business by the Department of Defense Office of
6	Naval Research; provided further that the business shall not be
7	eligible for a grant pursuant to this section if the business
8	has obtained any other state grant for the same research, other
9	than the grant awarded to the business by the Department of
10	Defense Office of Naval Research, at the time of or during the
11	duration of the alternative energy research and development
12	pilot program grant.
13	(c) The alternative energy research and development pilot
14	program shall cease to exist on June 30, 2019.
15	(d) The department of business, economic development, and
16	tourism shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii
17	Revised Statutes, necessary for the purposes of implementing the
18	alternative energy research and development pilot program.
19	PART II

1 SECTION 2. There is established the alternative energy 2 research and development revolving fund for the purpose of 3 promoting alternative energy research and development in Hawaii. 4 The alternative energy research and development revolving 5 fund shall be abolished on June 30, 2019, and all unencumbered 6 balances shall lapse to the credit of the general fund. 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be 10 deposited into the alternative energy research and development 11 revolving fund. 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the alternative 13 energy research and development revolving fund the sum of 14 \$1,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 15 year 2018-2019 for the purpose of providing grants pursuant to 16 this Act. 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii 18 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act. 19 PART III

SECTION 5. Section 206M-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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amended to read as follows:

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1 "[4] §206M-15.6[+] Hawaii technology loan and grant 2 revolving fund. There is established the Hawaii technology loan 3 and grant revolving fund for the purpose of investing in 4 technology development in Hawaii [+]; including providing grants 5 to promote alternative energy research and development in 6 The following shall be deposited into the Hawaii technology loan revolving fund: 7 8 (1) Appropriations from the legislature; 9 Moneys received as repayments of loans; (2) 10 (3) Investment earnings; 11 (4) Royalties; 12 Premiums, or fees or equity charged by the (5) 13 corporation, or otherwise received by the corporation; 14 and 15 (6) Loans that are convertible to equity; 16 provided that the total amount of moneys in the fund shall not 17 exceed \$2,000,000 at the end of any fiscal year." 18 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be

deposited into the Hawaii technology loan and grant revolving 1 2 fund. 3 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii technology loan and grant revolving fund the sum of \$1,000,000 4 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 5 for the purpose of providing grants pursuant to this Act. 6 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act. 8 9 PART IV 10 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018; provided that on June 30, 2019, section 5 of this Act shall be 11 12 repealed and section 206M-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall 13 be reenacted in the form in which it read on the day before the 14 effective date of this Act. 15 INTRODUCED BY
