### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

4	(2)	Update the 2008 department of health policy glass	
5		recycling draft dated July 1, 2008. The updated	
6		policy shall:	
7		(A) Equally allow recycling or down-cycling;	
8		(B) Clearly allow stockpiling of glass for the	
9		purposes of maintaining inventory;	
10	,	(C) Include a complete list of approved down-cycling	
11		options; and	
12		(D) Allow the use of glass as an alternative daily	
13		cover in the down-cycling options;	
14	(3)	Work with stakeholders to make practical policies and
