### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is located
- 2 approximately 2,506 miles from the continental United States.
- 3 About eighty-five to ninety per cent of Hawaii's food is
- 4 imported, which makes Hawaii particularly vulnerable to natural
- 5 disasters and global events that disrupt shipping and other
- 6 modes of transporting food. Furthermore, the economic impact of
- 7 food import replacement is significant. Food expenditures of
- 8 local consumers from 2004 to 2005 amounted to \$3,700,000,000.
- 9 Assuming that eighty-five per cent of the food consumed in the
- 10 State is imported, this translates to \$3,145,000,000 of food
- 11 expenditures leaving the State each year. In 2016, the
- 12 department of business, economic development, and tourism
- 13 released reports on consumer spending in 2014 (2013-2014 survey
- 14 period for the city and county of Honolulu) by county. Based on
- 15 those reports, each household in Hawaii spent an average of
- 16 \$9,100 on food during the survey period. Using the same
- 17 estimate of eighty-five per cent for imported food, each

- 1 household in Hawaii spent an average of \$7,740 on imported food
- 2 during the survey period. Growing food within the State enables
- 3 the expenditures on food to remain in the local economy.
- 4 The development of a whole farm system approach to
- 5 agriculture in Hawaii that pays close attention to soil health,
- 6 specifically increasing mineral availability and improving soil
- 7 structure, water-holding capacity, crop health, and food
- 8 nutrition levels, will lower water usage through deployment of
- 9 green manure, compost, and cover crops; reduce crop loss from
- 10 pest damage; and decrease weed pressure. This whole farm system
- 11 approach to agriculture can improve food security and benefit
- 12 the local economy through reducing production costs by promoting
- 13 locally sourced inputs and the manufacturing thereof. Teaching
- 14 a new generation of farmers to use this whole farm system
- 15 approach will create an alternative method of farming that
- 16 appeals to many young farmers across the State. Currently,
- 17 there is a shortage of qualified teachers for these farm
- 18 methods. Farmer apprentice mentoring aims to fulfill this need
- 19 by bringing the students to the farm and providing qualified
- 20 farm mentors with funding.

9	(1)	Practice sustainable agriculture as defined by the
10		Food, Agriculture, Conservation, and Trade Act of
11		1990, Public Law 101-624, title XVI, subtitle A,
12		section 1603; and
13	(2)	Recycle locally available organic, diverse plant and
14		animal agricultural nutrients, enhanced by
15		fermentation and other ecological processes such as
16		Korean natural farming as defined by the University of
17		Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
18		resources.
19	(b)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture shall
20	establish	the curriculum for the farm apprentice mentoring
21	program.

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 4 farm apprentice mentoring program to provide mentoring on a
- 5 whole farm system approach to agriculture.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
