A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL THEFT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that thefts of
- 2 agricultural products have plagued not only the commercial
- 3 agricultural business, but residents as well. Many agricultural
- 4 products produced on residential properties are sold at farmer's
- 5 markets or roadside stands, or given as gifts.
- 6 The legislature further finds that the department of
- 7 agriculture has contracted the prosecuting attorney's office of
- 8 the county of Hawaii to investigate numerous calls and
- 9 electronic mail from residents on thefts of agricultural
- 10 products being grown on their properties, but such cases are
- 11 difficult to effectively prosecute. A recent case involved the
- 12 theft of avocados from a residential property that were intended
- 13 to be given as gifts. At the preliminary hearing, the court
- 14 determined that the avocados needed to be maintained by a
- 15 commercial agricultural enterprise or research agency while
- 16 owned by the enterprise or agency in order for it to be
- 17 considered theft of an agricultural product.

1 The purpose of this Act is to clarify and strengthen the 2 existing law to allow for the protection of agricultural 3 products raised or produced by all people in the State. 4 SECTION 2. Section 708-800, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending the definition of "agricultural equipment, 6 supplies, or products" to read as follows: 7 ""Agricultural equipment, supplies, or products" mean any 8 agricultural equipment, supplies, or [commercial] agricultural 9 products [or commodities raised, grown, or maintained by a 10 commercial agricultural enterprise or research agency while 11 owned by the enterprise or agency.], including fruits, nuts, and 12 vegetables that are the food product of any tree, vine, or plant 13 or any horticultural, silvicultural, or floricultural product." 14 SECTION 3. Section 708-831, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **15** amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows: 16 "(1) A person commits the offense of theft in the second 17 degree if the person commits theft: 18 (a) Of property from the person of another; 19 Of property or services the value of which exceeds (b) 20 \$750;

(c)	Of an aquacultural product or part thereof from
	premises that are fenced or enclosed in a manner
	designed to exclude intruders or there is prominently
	displayed on the premises a sign or signs sufficient
	to give notice and reading as follows: "Private
	Property", "No Trespassing", or a substantially
	similar message;

Of agricultural equipment, supplies, or products, or 8 (d) 9 part thereof, the value of which exceeds \$100 but does **10** not exceed \$20,000, or of agricultural products that 11 exceed twenty-five pounds, from premises that are 12 fenced, enclosed, or secured in a manner designed to 13 exclude intruders or there is prominently displayed on 14 the premises a sign or signs sufficient to give notice 15 and reading as follows: "Private Property", "No 16 Trespassing", or a substantially similar message; or **17** if at the point of entry of the premise, a crop is 18 visible[. The sign or signs, containing letters not 19 less than two inches in height, shall be placed along 20 the boundary line of the land in a manner and in such 21 a position as to be clearly noticeable from outside

1		the boundary line. Possession of agricultural
2		products without ownership and movement certificates,
3		when a certificate is required pursuant to chapter
4		145, is prima facie evidence that the products are or
5		have been stolen]; or
6	(e)	Of agricultural commodities that are generally known
7		to be marketed for commercial purposes. Possession of
8		agricultural commodities without ownership and
9		movement certificates, when a certificate is required
10		pursuant to section 145-22, is prima facie evidence
11		that the products are or have been stolen; provided
12		that "agriculture commodities" has the same meaning as
13		in section 145-21."
14	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
15	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
16	begun bef	ore its effective date.
17	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2035.
