A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSERVATION OFFICER AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT TRAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's limited and
- 2 unique cultural and natural resources are vital to the State and
- 3 its residents. However, these resources may not be receiving
- 4 the protection required. According to a January 9, 2018, Hawaii
- 5 News Now report entitled "DLNR wants a training academy to solve
- 6 staffing shortage, increase enforcement," there is a shortage of
- 7 department of land and natural resources' conservation and
- 8 resources enforcement officers. This shortage is due to the
- 9 fact that the "officers are armed and the job requires prior law
- 10 enforcement experience," which severely limits the pool of
- 11 applicants to current and former employees of the few law
- 12 enforcement agencies in the State.
- 13 The legislature further finds that if the department of
- 14 land and natural resources had its own training academy, it
- 15 would no longer be limited to applicants with prior law
- 16 enforcement experience. The department of land and natural

- 1 resources has collaborated with the University of Hawaii,
- 2 William S. Richardson school of law to establish a training
- 3 academy. The law school has already taken a first step in the
- 4 process of establishing the training academy by securing a
- 5 \$148,000 grant from the Harold K.L. Castle Foundation. However,
- 6 additional moneys are needed before the training academy can be
- 7 established.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 9 moneys to the department of land and natural resources for the
- 10 establishment of a training academy for conservation and
- 11 resources enforcement officers.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,928 or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 15 establishment of a training academy for conservation and
- 16 resources enforcement officers, including:
- 17 (1) One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent
- 18 educational specialist position; and
- 19 (2) One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent office
- assistant position.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
