### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PALLIATIVE CARE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§34</u>	6- Coverage of palliative care services. (a) The	
5	State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs shall		
6	cover palliative care services.		
7	(b)	The department shall:	
8	(1)	Adopt rules and provide technical assistance for the	
9		State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service	
10		programs to ensure delivery of palliative care	
11		services; and	
12	(2)	Establish guidance on the medical conditions and	
13		prognoses that render an individual eligible for the	
14		palliative care services under this section.	
15	(c)	Covered services under this section shall include but	
16	are not l	imited to hospice benefits available through the	
17	State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs.		

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1	(d) Authorized providers of medical care shall include		
2	licensed hospice agencies and home health agencies licensed to		
3	provide hospice care that are contracted by the State's medicaid		
4	managed care and fee-for-service programs to provide palliative		
5	care services.		
6	(e) Nothing in this section shall eliminate or reduce any		
7	covered benefits or services under the State's medicaid managed		
8	care and fee-for-service programs.		
9	(f) This section shall not affect an individual's		
10	eligibility to receive, concurrently with the palliative care		
11	services required by this section, any services, including home		
12	health services, for which the individual would have been		
13	eligible in the absence of this section.		
14	(g) For purposes of this section:		
15	"Covered services" means the following, regardless of		
16	whether these services are covered under the State's medicaid		
17	managed care and fee-for-service hospice benefits:		
18	(1) Hospice services that are provided at the same time		
19	that curative treatment is available, to the extent		
20	that the services are not duplicative;		

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1	(2)	Hospice services provided to individuals whose
2		conditions may result in death, regardless of the
3		estimated length of the individual's remaining period
4		of life; and
5	(3)	Any other services the department determines to be
6		appropriate.
7	<u>"Pal</u>	liative care services" includes but is not limited to
8	the follo	wing services:
9	(1)	Specialized medical care and emotional and spiritual
10		support for people with serious advanced illnesses;
11	(2)	Relief of symptoms, pain, and stress of serious
12		illness;
13	(3)	Improvement of quality of life for a palliative care
14		patient and the patient's family; and
15	(4)	Appropriate care for any age and for any stage of
16		serious illness, along with curative treatment."
