RELATING TO EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Participation in extracurricular activities by
5	home schooled children. (a) A child who is home schooled in
6	accordance with section 302A-1132 shall be eligible to
7	participate in extracurricular activities at the public school
8	that the child would otherwise be required to attend. A home
9	schooled child who wishes to participate in an extracurricular
10	activity shall meet:
11	(1) The health requirements set forth in sections
12	302A-1154 through 302A-1157, prior to the child's
13	participation in the extracurricular activity; and
14	(2) The participation requirements and restrictions for
15	the extracurricular activity, including maintaining
16	appropriate grade point averages and paying
17	appropriate fees; provided that the requirements or

1		restrictions shall not be inconsistent with this
2		section.
3	(b)	The department may adopt rules:
4	(1)	To implement this section and to provide procedures by
5		which a home schooled child may apply to participate
6		in extracurricular activities; and
7	(2)	Setting forth which programs qualify as
8		extracurricular activities under this section.
9	<u>(c)</u>	As used in this section, "extracurricular activity"
10	means a so	chool-authorized or education-related activity
11	occurring	during or outside the regular instructional school
12	day, incl	uding sports, cheerleading, clubs, and other programs.

14	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
