### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANCER.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that "80% by 2018" is an
2	initiative by the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable, a
3	working group established by the United States Centers for
4	Disease Control and Prevention and other national cancer control
5	stakeholders, in which organizations have committed to
6	eliminating colorectal cancer as a major public health problem
7	and are working toward the shared goal of getting eighty per
8	cent of adults aged fifty and older screened for colorectal
9	cancer by 2018.
10	The "80% by 2018" initiative is vital to reducing the
11	burden of cancer because:
12	(1) Colorectal cancer is the third leading cause of cancer
13	death in men and women in the United States, and a
14	cause of considerable suffering among more than one
15	hundred forty thousand adults diagnosed with

(2) When adults get screened for colorectal cancer, it can be detected early at a stage when treatment is most

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colorectal cancer each year;

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1		likely to be successful, and in some cases, it can be
2		prevented through the detection and removal of
3		precancerous polyps;
4	(3)	About twenty-three million people, which is about one
5		in three adults between fifty and seventy-five years
6		old, are not getting tested as recommended;
7	(4)	The people less likely to get tested are rural
8		populations, men, those aged fifty to sixty-four, and
9		those with lower education and income;
10	(5)	There are several recommended screening test options,
11		including colonoscopy, stool tests such as a guaiac
12		fecal occult blood test or fecal immunochemical test,
13		and sigmoidoscopy;
14	(6)	Screening can save lives but only if people get
15		tested; and
16	(7)	The best test is the test that gets done.
17	The	legislature further finds that according to the United
18	States Ce	nters for Disease Control and Prevention data, Hawaii's
19	current s	creening rate for colorectal cancer is sixty-four per
20	cent. Ha	waii's screening rate, however, when compared to all

- 1 states ranks in the bottom half, indicating there is more work
- 2 to be done to increase colorectal cancer screening rates.
- 3 The legislature also finds that the "80% by 2018"
- 4 initiative's goal of increasing the colorectal cancer screening
- 5 rate to eighty per cent by 2018 will increase the quality of
- 6 life for hundreds of people in the State by detecting and
- 7 preventing death from late stage colorectal cancer and lessening
- 8 the physical, emotional, and financial burden that may come with
- 9 a cancer diagnosis.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to launch a colorectal cancer
- 11 screening and awareness pilot program to promote and encourage
- 12 screening through a public awareness campaign to help the State
- 13 achieve an increase in screening rates in conjunction with the
- 14 "80% by 2018" initiative. The pilot program will be a systems-
- 15 approach to increase overall population-based screening to
- 16 achieve the eighty per cent objective, and to reach and screen
- 17 populations at high risk for colorectal cancer, especially those
- 18 who do not have medical insurance.
- 19 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the colorectal cancer
- 20 screening and awareness pilot program, to be administered by the
- 21 department of health. The department of health shall:

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1	(1)	Provide public education to:
2		(A) Promote colorectal cancer screening; and
3		(B) Provide specific education to populations at high
4		risk for colorectal cancer; and
5	(2)	Collaborate with health care providers to integrate
6		colorectal cancer screenings into their standard
7		practice according to the guidelines of the United
8		States Preventative Services Task Force; and
9	(3)	Partner with health care providers to screen eligible
10		participants according to the guidelines of the United
11		States Preventative Services Task Force, as described
12		in subsection (b).
13	(b)	To be an eligible participant to receive screening
14	pursuant	to subsection (a)(3), a person shall:
15	(1)	Be at least fifty years of age, or have a high risk
16		for colorectal cancer if under the age of fifty;
17	(2)	Be uninsured, or if underinsured have coverage that
18		does not cover the full cost of colorectal cancer
19		screenings;
20	(3)	Not be eligible for medical assistance; and

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1	(4)	Have a gross family income at or below two hundred
2		fifty per cent of the poverty level.
3	(c)	For purposes of this section, an eligible participant
4	is consid	lered "high risk for colorectal cancer" if the person
5	has:	
6	(1)	A family history of colorectal cancer;
7	(2)	A prior occurrence of cancer or precursor neoplastic
8		polyps;
9	(3)	A prior occurrence of a chronic digestive disease or
10		condition; or
11	(4)	Other predisposing factors, as determined by the
12		department of health.
13	(d)	The department of health shall submit to the
14	legislatu	re:
15	(1)	A preliminary report no later than twenty days prior
16		to the convening of the regular session of 2018 on the
17		expenditure of funds for the colorectal cancer
18		screening and awareness pilot program as of the date
19		of the preliminary report; and
20	(2)	A final report no later than twenty days prior to the

convening of the regular session of 2020 on the

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1	expenditure of all funds for the colorectal cancer
2	screening and awareness pilot program as of the date
3	of the final report.
4	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
5	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
6	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
7	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
8	year 2018-2019 for the colorectal cancer screening and awareness
9	pilot program established pursuant to this Act.
10	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
11	of health for the purposes of this Act.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017, and
13	shall be repealed on June 30, 2020.
