A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 251, Session
- 2 Laws of Hawaii 1997 (Act 251), provided much demanded and much
- 3 needed amendments to the motor vehicle insurance law to reduce
- 4 motor vehicle insurance premiums and preserve adequate
- 5 protection of the rights of drivers. One provision in Act 251
- 6 tied all provider fees to the medicare fee schedule used under
- 7 workers' compensation law and set the benefit for chiropractic
- 8 and acupuncture treatments at thirty visits at no more than \$75
- 9 per visit. Acupuncture codes were not included in the medicare
- 10 fee schedule as of the effective date of Act 251, and
- 11 acupuncturists were therefore placed under the same restrictions
- 12 as chiropractors. The benefit allowed for acupuncture
- 13 treatments has not increased in nearly twenty years, while rates
- 14 for other services, such as physical therapy and medical office
- 15 visits, have increased over the years.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to tie the authorized benefit
- 17 for acupuncture treatments allowed under personal injury



- 1 protection benefits provided through motor vehicle insurance to
- 2 the workers' compensation supplemental medical fee schedule.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 431:10C-103.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 4 is amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 5 "(c) Acupuncture treatments shall be allowed for no more
- 6 than thirty visits [at no more than \$75 a visit]. The charges
- 7 for acupuncture treatments under this section shall be tied to
- 8 the charges, and any subsequent increases in charges,
- 9 permissible under the workers' compensation supplemental medical
- 10 fee schedule."
- 11 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
