A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL TRESPASS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify that a
- 2 person who has been provided with a reasonable warning or
- 3 request to leave commercial premises, in accordance with section
- 4 708-814(1)(b), may be held criminally liable for the offense of
- 5 burglary in the second degree if the person enters or remains
- 6 unlawfully in or upon commercial premises, in defiance of the
- 7 reasonable warning or request to leave, with intent to commit
- 8 therein a crime against a person or against property rights; and
- 9 that a reasonable warning or request to leave commercial
- 10 premises may include all commercial premises owned or leased by
- 11 an owner or lessee, respectively.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 708-800, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending the definition of "enter or remain
- 14 unlawfully" to read as follows:
- ""Enter or remain unlawfully" means to enter or remain in
- 16 or upon premises when the person is not licensed, invited, or
- 17 otherwise privileged to do so. A person who, regardless of the

- 1 person's intent, enters or remains in or upon premises [which]
- 2 that are at the time open to the public does so with license and
- 3 privilege unless the person defies a lawful order not to enter
- 4 or remain, personally communicated to the person by the owner of
- 5 the premises or some other authorized person[-], including a
- 6 reasonable warning or request to leave by the owner or lessee of
- 7 commercial premises, the owner's or lessee's authorized agent,
- 8 or a police officer made in accordance with section 708-
- 9 814(1)(b). A license or privilege to enter or remain in a
- 10 building [which] that is only partly open to the public is not a
- 11 license or privilege to enter or remain in that part of the
- 12 building [which] that is not open to the public."
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 15 begun before its effective date.
- 16 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
