# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 346-157, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]\$346-157[+] Liability insurance coverage; [no] 4 requirement. (a) For the purpose of this section, "liability 5 insurance coverage" means a general casualty insurance policy 6 issued to a provider insuring against legal liability for injury 7 resulting from negligence to a child during the time the child 8 is under the care of the child care provider. 9 The department shall [not] require [a provider] all providers to obtain [or] and maintain liability insurance 10 11 coverage in an amount not less than \$ as a condition 12 of licensure, temporary permission, or registration to operate a 13 child care facility. 14 (c) The department, as a condition of continued licensure, 15 temporary permission, or registration, shall require [a provider 16 who does not have liability insurance coverage] all providers to 17 disclose in writing [that the provider does not have coverage] to each parent or guardian: 18

3		including the insurer's name and contact information,
4		coverage amounts, and effective dates for the
5		provider's liability insurance coverage at the time of
6		application; or
7	(2)	Within seven working days of any change, cancellation,
8		or termination of liability insurance coverage if the
9		coverage is changed, canceled, or terminated while the
10		parent's or guardian's child is cared for at the
11		provider's facility.
12	(d)	The department may suspend or revoke a license,
13	temporary	permit, or certificate of registration of a provider
14	in accorda	ance with section 346-164 or 346-175, if [ <del>the</del> ]:
15	(1)	The provider or any employee of the provider knowingly
16		makes a false statement to any person concerning the
17		provider's liability insurance coverage[-]; or
18	(2)	The provider does not comply with the insurance
19		coverage and disclosure requirements of this section
20		and rules adopted by the department pursuant to this
21		section.

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1	(e) Proof of liability insurance as required by this
2	section shall be verified by the department on an annual basis.
3	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
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### Report Title:

Child Care Providers; Liability Insurance

### Description:

Requires all child care providers subject to regulation by the Department of Human Services to obtain and maintain liability insurance as a condition of licensure, temporary permission, or registration. Takes effect 1/1/2050. (SD1)

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
