A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GRAFFITI.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that throughout the
- 2 State, graffiti is a problem in most communities. Graffiti
- 3 appears on public and private property, causes visual blight,
- 4 and results in unsightly scenery. Individuals engaging in
- 5 graffiti typically tag buildings, walls, bus stops, bridges,
- 6 underpasses, construction sites, concrete columns, postal mail
- 7 boxes, signs, trees, vehicles, and other surfaces able to
- 8 accommodate their marks and messages. In some cases, taggers
- 9 place themselves in dangerous situations that could lead to
- 10 injury or death. To date, the problem persists despite
- 11 community efforts to combat graffiti.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to reduce graffiti
- 13 by funding and creating an anti-graffiti program coordinator
- 14 position under the office of the lieutenant governor and
- 15 appropriating funds for the implementation of an anti-graffiti
- 16 program to detect taggers on state property through the use of
- 17 cameras and high resolution photos. The coordinator will work

- 1 with the department of education, county police departments,
- 2 businesses, youth organizations, and other interested
- 3 stakeholders to eliminate graffiti.
- 4 SECTION 2. There is established within the office of the
- 5 lieutenant governor, for administrative purposes only, an anti-
- 6 graffiti program that uses cameras and high resolution photos to
- 7 detect taggers on state property. The office of the lieutenant
- 8 governor shall hire one full-time equivalent anti-graffiti
- 9 program coordinator position beginning on July 1, 2017, to work
- 10 with public agencies and other organizations to determine sites
- 11 for implementation of the anti-graffiti program and to advocate
- 12 against graffiti in the communities.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 16 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 17 year 2018-2019 for the establishment of one full-time equivalent
- 18 anti-graffiti program coordinator.
- 19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 20 the lieutenant governor for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 4 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 5 year 2018-2019 to implement an anti-graffiti program to detect
- 6 taggers on state property through the use of cameras and high
- 7 resolution photos on state property.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 9 the lieutenant governor for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017, and
- 11 shall be repealed on July 1, 2020.
