A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOUSELESS BILL OF RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

. 1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HOUSELESS BILL OF RIGHTS
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context otherwise requires:
8	"Houseless" means:
9	(1) An individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular,
10	and adequate night-time residence; or
11	(2) An individual or family who has a primary night-time
12	residence that is:
13	(A) A supervised publicly or privately operated
14	shelter designed to provide temporary living
15	accommodations;

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1	(B)	An institution that provides temporary residence
2		for individuals intended to be institutionalized;
3		or

- (C) A public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as sleeping accommodations for human beings.
- 7 This term does not include any individual imprisoned or 8 otherwise detained under an act of Congress or a state law.
- 9 "Life-sustaining activities" includes but is not limited to 10 eating, sleeping, standing, sitting, and using and moving freely
- 12 -2 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to 13 ameliorate adverse effects visited upon individuals when those 14 individuals lack a home.
- -3 Houseless bill of rights; findings. 16 legislature finds that no person's rights, privileges, or access **17** to public services may be denied solely because a person is
- 18 houseless, and a houseless individual shall be granted the same 19 rights as any other person.
- -4 Bill of rights. (a) The houseless bill of rights 20 21 includes the following guarantees to houseless individuals:

1	(1)	The right to engage in life-sustaining activities,
2		including the right to use and move freely in public
3		spaces, including but not limited to public sidewalks,
4		public parks, public transportation, and public
5		buildings, in the same manner as any other person
6		without discrimination on the basis of housing status;
7	(2)	The right to equal treatment by all state and county
8		agencies without discrimination on the basis of
9		housing status;
10	(3)	The right to access fair housing and equal employment
11		opportunity without discrimination due to the lack of
12		a permanent mailing address or the fact that the
13		individual's mailing address is the mailing address of
14		a shelter or social service provider;
15	(4)	The right to emergency medical care free from
16		discrimination on the basis of housing status;
17	(5)	The right to vote, register to vote, and receive
18		documentation necessary to prove identity for voting
19		without discrimination on the basis of housing status;
20	(6)	The right to protection from disclosure of records and

information, without proper legal authority, and the

1		right to confidentiality of records and information in
2		accordance with the Federal Homeless Management
3		Information System, the Patient Protection and
4		Affordable Care Act, and the Federal Violence Against
5		Women Act;
6	(7)	The right to a reasonable expectation of privacy in
7		personal property, including but not limited to
8		identification, food, water, medication, and all
9		objects necessary for life-sustaining activities, such
10		as clothing, blankets, pillows, and backpacks, to the
11		same extent as personal property in a permanent
12		residence;
13	(8)	The right to access temporary and permanent shelters
14		without discrimination on the basis of any protected
15		class;
16	(9)	The right to sleep in a legally parked automobile;
17		provided that the automobile is properly registered,
18		licensed, safety inspected, and insured;
19	(10)	The equal opportunity to have twenty-four-hour access
20		to public hygiene facilities and live in decent, safe,
21		sanitary, and healthful accommodations anywhere within

,1		the State, regardless of housing status, but not
2		including access to environmentally sensitive areas;
3		and
4	(11)	Action by the State, a county, or private organization
5		shall not impede an individual's ability to maintain
6		access to services essential to survival, including
7		but not limited to medical services, shelter, food,
8		and water.
9	(b)	The rights afforded to houseless persons to ensure
10	that their	r person, privacy, and property are safeguarded and
11	protected	as set forth in this chapter are available only
12	insofar as	s they are implemented in accordance with other state
13	or county	laws, state rules and regulations, federal law, and
14	the const:	itutions of the State and the United States."
