A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Constitution of
- 2 the State of Hawaii provides for the preservation and promotion
- 3 of native Hawaiian culture, history, and language. Article X,
- 4 section 4, of the Hawaii State Constitution provides that "[t]he
- 5 State shall promote the study of Hawaiian culture, history and
- 6 language." Article XII, section 7, of the Hawaii State
- 7 Constitution provides that "[t]he State reaffirms and shall
- 8 protect all rights, customarily and traditionally exercised for
- 9 subsistence, cultural and religious purposes and possessed by
- 10 ahupua'a tenants who are descendants of native Hawaiians who
- 11 inhabited the Hawaiian Islands prior to 1778, subject to the
- 12 right of the State to regulate such rights." Because
- 13 maintaining a living language is an integral component of
- 14 preserving a culture, article XV, section 4, of the Hawaii State
- 15 Constitution establishes that English and Hawaiian are the
- 16 official languages of Hawai'i.

1 The legislature reaffirms Hawaiian as one of its official languages and has supported efforts to incorporate the Hawaiian 2 language into official state writings, emblems, and signs. 3 use of proper Hawaiian macrons and glottal stops shows not only 4 5 the deserved respect for the native language of these islands, but also fully comports with the intent and purpose of the state 6 7 constitution. The purpose of this Act is to require all newly created, 8 replaced, or reprinted state and county documents, letterheads, 9 symbols, and emblems to contain accurate, appropriate, and 10 authentic Hawaiian names and language beginning on January 1, 11 12 2018. SECTION 2. Section 1-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 "[+] §1-13.5[+] Hawaiian language; spelling. [Macrons and 15 glottal stops may be used in the spelling of words or terms in 16 the Hawaiian language in] (a) Effective January 1, 2018, all 17 documents and letterheads prepared by or for state or county 18 agencies or officials [-] shall include accurate, appropriate, 19 and authentic Hawaiian names and words, including proper 20

Hawaiian spelling and punctuation, including but not limited to

2	which they relate; provided that any revision to conform any	
3	document or letterhead existing on or before January 1, 2018, to	
4	the requi	rements of this section, may be implemented when the
5	document	or letterhead requires replacement or reprinting, or
6	otherwise requires revision. Any rule, order, policy, or other	
7	act, official or otherwise, that prohibits or discourages the	
8	use of [t	hese symbols] accurate, appropriate, and authentic
9	Hawaiian	names and words, as required by this section, shall be
10	void.	
11	(b)	Hawaiian names and words shall be deemed accurate,
12	appropriate, and authentic when printed in conformance with:

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 5-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+] §5-6.5[+] State language. (a) The Hawaiian language
- 4 is the native language of [Hawaii] Hawaii and [may], effective
- 5 January 1, 2018, shall be used on all emblems and symbols
- 6 representative of the State, its departments, agencies, and
- 7 political subdivisions [-]; provided that for emblems and symbols
- 8 existing on January 1, 2018, conformance with this section may
- 9 be delayed until a replacement for the emblem or symbol
- 10 otherwise is required.
- 11 (b) The Hawaiian language as used on all emblems and
- 12 symbols shall be in conformance with the requirements of section
- 13 1-13.5(b)."
- 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on March 9, 2092.

Hawaiian Language; Letterhead; Documents; Symbols; Emblems; Government Documents

Description:

Requires all newly created, replaced, or reprinted state and county letterheads, documents, symbols, and emblems to include accurate, appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and language. Establishes references for accurate, appropriate, and authentic Hawaiian names and words, including proper Hawaiian spelling and punctuation. Effective 3/9/2092. (SD2)

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
