SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE NEEDS AND COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AUDIO AND VIDEO TECHNOLOGY TO PROVIDE ACCESS FOR ALL STATE RESIDENTS TO TESTIFY IN-PERSON ON LEGISLATION.

WHEREAS, legislative rules and practices encourage robust debate provided through testimony from members of the public; and

WHEREAS, many important legislative issues may disproportionately impact citizens on the neighbor islands; and

WHEREAS, the constrictive and fast-paced legislative timetable can place a severe financial hardship on neighbor island residents wishing to actively participate in the democratic process; and

WHEREAS, modern audio and video technology and the Internet make it possible for individuals to virtually attend and provide testimony in legislative hearings; and

WHEREAS, the public and its ability to engage lawmakers and participate fully in the democratic process would greatly benefit from safe, stable, and secure Internet-based telecommunications access; and

WHEREAS, there are operational and technical issues that must first be worked through in order to implement such a program; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a study on the needs and costs associated with the implementation of audio and video 1

technology to provide all state residents with the opportunity to provide oral testimony at all legislative hearings; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than December 1, 2018; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Legislative Reference Bureau.
