SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO EVALUATE THE IMPORT REQUIREMENTS AND PROCESS FOR DOMESTIC ANIMALS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's current system for importing domestic animals into the state is outdated, complicated, and exploitive; and

WHEREAS, current Department of Agriculture rules require dogs, cats, and other carnivores originating from the United States and other non-exempted areas, upon arrival in the State, to be confined to a quarantine station for a period up to one hundred twenty days to prevent the introduction of rabies to the State; and

WHEREAS, the import process is lengthy, costly, and stressful for both the pet owner and animals; and

WHEREAS, possible improvements to the process include:

- (1) Updates so that the entire import process can transpire online;
- (2) Discounted rates and special accommodations for service animals; and
- (3) Pricing regulations for veterinarians who do airport checkups on neighbor islands;
