SB 2839, SD2 (SSCR2723) Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISES. Establishes a new agricultural enterprise program within the department of agriculture to plan, design, construct, operate, manage, maintain, repair, demolish, and remove infrastructure on any lands under the jurisdiction of the department, to support and promote agriculture. Creates two new positions to implement the program. Establishes the agricultural enterprise special fund. Makes an appropriation. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
SB 2116, SD1 (SSCR2620) Status	RELATING TO BIOSECURITY. Establishes the biosecurity emergency response special fund within the Department of Agriculture. Establishes procedures for emergency declarations and expenditures. Appropriates moneys into the special fund. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Agriculture. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
SB 2396, SD2 (SSCR2904) Status	RELATING TO LOAN PROGRAMS. Appropriates funds for and out of the agricultural loan revolving fund and Hawaii water infrastructure special fund. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
SB 3031, SD2 (SSCR2677) Status	RELATING TO THE ORGANIC FOODS PRODUCTION TAX CREDIT. Clarifies and strengthens the organic foods production tax credit. Effective 7/1/2050. Applies to unspecified taxable years. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
SB 2074, SD1 (SSCR2855) Status	RELATING TO THE IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LAND QUALIFIED AGRICULTURAL COST TAX CREDIT. Extends through the 2028 taxable year the time in which the Department of Agriculture may certify important agricultural lands	AGR, FIN

qualified agricultural cost tax credits. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

RELATING TO IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS. SB 2168, SD1 (SSCR2896) Implements Act 183, SLH 2005, in accordance with the State's Status constitutional duty to protect important agricultural lands by providing funds to the counties for the identification and mapping of important agricultural lands. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) SB 3033, SD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL THEFT. (SSCR2616) Amends the definition of agricultural equipment, supplies, or products. Status Strengthens property right protections for persons who produce agricultural products on private residential property. Effective 7/1/2035. (SD1) SB 2113, SD2 RELATING TO ANIMALS. (SSCR2607) Prohibits manufacturers and contract testing facilities in Hawaii from Status using animal test methods for the purpose of testing cosmetics or household products for which an alternative test method is available.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Imposes a civil fine and authorizes the attorney general to seek injunctive relief and any other recovery of damages. Effective
