SB 2921, SD1 (SSCR2524) Status RELATING TO STATE LIBRARY SYSTEM.

EDN, FIN

Specifies that unclaimed funds of \$10 or less in the unclaimed property trust fund, upon the expiration of a ten-year time limitation, shall escheat to the State and transferred to the libraries special fund. Specifies that unclaimed funds of more than \$10 but less than \$250 in the unclaimed property trust fund, upon expiration of the ten-year time limitation, shall escheat to the State and be transferred to the general fund. Status

Authorizes the state librarian to designate one or more public library employees to be a notary public. Allows designated employees to perform notary services in nongovernmental matters for fees to be deposited into the library fee for enhanced services special fund.

SB 2655, SD2 (SSCR2786) Status RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGY.

EDN, IAC/CPC,

Establishes licensure requirements for school psychologists to be administered by the board of psychology. Requires all school psychologists, including school psychologists employed by the department of education, to be licensed by 7/1/2021. Amends the

composition of the board to include two school psychologists. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 2665, SD1 (SSCR2912) Status RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS.

Codifies sustainable development goals based on the United Nations'

Global Goal four, quality education. (SD1)

SB 2239, SD2 (SSCR2721) Status RELATING TO COLLEGE PLACEMENT EXAMINATION FEES. Appropriates moneys for the payment of SAT or ACT registration fees for public school students in the twelfth grade, and public charter school students in the eleventh or twelfth grade, who have not taken the SAT or ACT. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
