HB 2257, HD2 (HSCR676-18) Status

RELATING TO VIRTUAL CURRENCY.

IAC, CPC, FIN

Adopts certain operative provisions of the Uniform Regulation of Virtual Currency Businesses Act. Extends the money transmitters act to expressly apply to persons engaged in the transmission of virtual currency. Requires licensees dealing with virtual currency to provide a warning to consumers prior to entering into an agreement with them.

HB 1968, HD1 (HSCR621-18) Status	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COLLEGE OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESOURCES COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE. HB 1882, HD1 (HSCR568-18) Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Appropriates funds for laptop computers or tablets to be used by teachers and students for digital teaching and learning.	EDN, FIN
HB 2607, HD1 (HSCR685-18) Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires the Department of Education (DOE) to develop and implement a statewide computer science curricula plan for public school students in K-12 and ensure each public high school offers at least one computer science course each school year. HB 2354, HD1 (HSCR688-18) Status	RELATING TO THE INCOME CHECK-OFF. Changes from \$2 to an unspecified amount of authorized income tax check-off that may be designated payable from an individual's state income tax refund to the libraries special fund. Changes from \$4 or \$8 to an unspecified amount permitted to joint filers in the designation of check-off to the Libraries Special Fund. Effective for taxable years after December 31, 2017.	EDN, FIN

HB 2679, HD1 (HSCR574-18) Status	RELATING THE TRANSFER OF LANDS. Transfers fee interest in certain public school lands from City and County of Honolulu and the Department of Land and Natural Resources, as applicable, to the Department of Education.	EDN/WAL, FIN
HB 2162, HD1 (HSCR520-18) Status	RELATING TO TEACHER INCENTIVES. Clarifies that funds for bonuses required by statute or collective bargaining shall not be paid out of a charter school's facilities funding or per-pupil funds. Beginning with fiscal year 2018-2019, requires that such bonuses be separate line items in the budget. Appropriates funds for teacher bonuses for hard-to-fill placement incentives and National Board certified teacher incentives for charter school teachers.	EDN/LAB, FIN
HB 2508, HD1 (HSCR569-18) Status	RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS. Appropriates general funds for infrastructure costs, rental or lease assistance, and the repair and maintenance of network infrastructure for charter schools.	EDN, FIN
HB 2164, HD1 (HSCR522-18) Status	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION. Appropriates funds to the Department of Education for school-level funding.	EDN, FIN
HB 1941, HD1 (HSCR524-18) Status	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Establishes one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) world languages institutional support position within the Department of Education. Appropriates funds to fund the position.	EDN, FIN
HB 2139, HD1 (HSCR596-18) Status	RELATING TO DISCRIMINATION IN EDUCATION. Prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex, including gender identity or expression, or sexual orientation, in any state educational program or activity, or in any educational program or activity that receives state financial assistance.
