HB 1968 Status RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COLLEGE OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESOURCES

COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE.

Appropriates funds to the UH college of tropical agriculture and human resources cooperative extension service for one full-time

ornamental plant extension agent.

HB 1639 Status RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

HED, FIN

Provides for the planning and design of the relocation of the University of Hawaii Maui College culinary arts program to Lahaina. Requires that the Chancellor work with hotels, resorts, and landowners of adjacent properties to develop a plan. Makes an appropriation.

HB 474 (HSCR40) Status

RELATING TO RAT LUNGWORM DISEASE.

Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii at Hilo, the department of health, department of land and natural resources, and department of

agriculture for programs, studies, and activities related to rat lungworm

disease.

HB 2093 Status

RELATING TO THE REGENTS CANDIDATE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

HED, FIN

Expands the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii from seven to eight members to make the member of the Association of Emeritus Regents of the University of

Hawaii a voting member. Specifies term conditions.
