HB 2735 Status

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HED, HHS, JUD

Prohibits tobacco use and smoking, including the use of electronic

smoking devices, by any person on the premises of UH.

HB 2506 Status RELATING TO RAT LUNGWORM DISEASE.

HED, FIN

Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii at Hilo for research and other activities related to rat lungworm disease. Conditions release of the funds on the University submitting a report to the legislature listing the specific research and activities it plans to undertake. Requires the University, along with the Department of Health, Department of Land and Natural Resources, Department of Agriculture, and Joint Rat Lungworm Task Force, to create a statewide plan for the eradication

and prevention of rat lungworm disease.
