RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY

HED, FIN

Status

COLLEGE PROMISE PROGRAM. Establishes the University of Hawaii Community College Promise

Program to provide scholarships for the unmet direct cost needs of qualified students enrolled at any community college campus of the University of Hawaii system. Appropriates funds to establish and

implement the program.

HB 2640

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PROMISE PROGRAM.

HED, FIN

Status

Makes scholarships under the Hawaii promise program available to any qualified student enrolled at the University of Hawaii, regardless

of whether the student is enrolled at a community college. Establishes a trust fund for the program. Increases individual income taxes for the highest income earners to provide funding for the program.

HB 2082 Status

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PROMISE PROGRAM.

HED, FIN

Establishes the University of Hawaii Promise Program to provide scholarships for the unmet direct cost needs of qualified students pursuing an undergraduate degree in registered nursing, elementary or secondary education, and civil engineering and enrolled at any campus of the University of Hawaii system. Appropriates funds to establish

and implement the program.

HB 2165 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PROMISE HED, FIN PROGRAM. Status Establishes the University of Hawaii Promise Program to provide scholarships for the unmet direct cost needs of qualified students enrolled at any campus of the University of Hawaii system or any community college campus. Appropriates funds to establish and implement the program. Creates a special fund. RELATING TO THE PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL SPACE HB 2324, HD1 EDB, HED, FIN (HSCR79-18) CENTER FOR EXPLORATION SYSTEMS. Amends section 201-76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to expressly place Status the Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems within the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism. Removes the Executive Director of the space center as a member of the board and adds the Chancellor of the University of Hawaii at Hilo. (HB2324 HD1) RELATING TO TUITION ASSISTANCE. HB 2089, HD1 VMI, HED, FIN (HSCR38-18) Permits the Adjutant General to extend the University of Hawaii tuition assistance awards to qualified retired Hawaii National Guard <u>Status</u> enlisted persons, warrant officers, and company grade officers. (HB2089 HD1) RELATING TO EDUCATION. HB 2113, HD1 LAB, HED, FIN (HSCR127-18) Directs the Department of Human Resources Development to Status provide University of Hawaii tuition grants to state employees who commit to continued employment with the State after graduation. Appropriates moneys. (HB2113 HD1) HB 2172, HD1 RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PUBLIC-PRIVATE LAB, HED, FIN (HSCR128-18) PARTNERSHIPS. Authorizes the University of Hawaii to enter into public-private Status

Authorizes the University of Hawaii to enter into public-private partnerships and establishes an Office of Strategic Partnerships and Development to specifically analyze, evaluate, recommend, coordinate, oversee, and manage public-private partnerships that benefit the University of Hawaii. (HB2172 HD1)
