HB 2147

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HHS, JUD, FIN

Status

Establishes a pre-arrest diversion pilot project for individuals with mental health or substance abuse challenges who allegedly commit nonviolent, non-felony offenses on state property. Appropriates funds.

HB 2208

RELATING TO ASSOCIATION HEALTH PLANS.

HHS, CPC

Status

Requires association health plan policies to comply with the laws of this State regardless of the association's domicile. Enables certain voluntary associations, including employer associations that issue association health plans, to qualify for authorization to transact

insurance in the State.

HB 2209

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

HHS, CPC, FIN

Status

Establishes an individual mandate for certain qualified taxpayers to sign up and maintain health insurance throughout the year, or pay a

penalty on their individual income tax return.

Status

Establishes and appropriates funds for one full-time equivalent (1.00

FTE) permanent veterinary medical officer position within the

Department of Health.

HB 2664 Status RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS.

HHS, CPC/JUD,

FIN

Requires and appropriates funds to the counties to establish medical

cannabis collectives to regulate and tax the distribution of medical cannabis. Amends primary caregivers' and qualifying patients' defense related to medical cannabis. Defines distribution to allow qualifying patients to transfer medical cannabis between themselves. Defines medical cannabis collective as a county-licensed entity that provides

cannabis to qualifying patients.

RELATING TO RAT LUNGWORM DISEASE.

HHS, HED, FIN

Status

Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii at Hilo for programs, studies, and activities related to the prevention and eradication of rat

lungworm disease.

HB 2663

RELATING TO DISTRICT HEALTH OFFICERS OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

HHS, LAB, FIN

Status

Requires each district health officer of the Department of Health to be a physician licensed to practice medicine under Part I of Chapter 453

of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

HB 2319 Status

RELATING TO INCOME WITHHOLDING FOR CHILD SUPPORT.

HHS, JUD, FIN

Amends the income withholding requirements to impose a fine against any employer who discharges from employment, refuses to employ, or takes disciplinary action against any noncustodial parent subject to income withholding, or who fails to comply with an order of

assignment of future income. Takes effect upon approval.

Establishes a suicide prevention task force to develop a strategic plan

to reduce suicide in Hawaii by 25% by 2025.

HB 1924

RELATING TO HEALTH.

Proposed HD1 Status

Proposed HD1: Authorizes pharmacists to prescribe and dispense an opioid antagonist to patients and to family members and caregivers of opioid patients without the need for a written, approved collaborative agreement. Appropriates funds for drug treatment for opioid abuse, methamphetamine abuse, heroin abuse, prescription drug abuse, and

other drug or alcohol abuse.

Appropriates funds for positions to increase school-health coordination for and among the Department of Education, Department of Health, and Department of Human Services. Establishes evidence-based screenings and assessment for school vision, oral health, and behavioral health. Effective 7/1/2025. (HB2185 HD1)

Authorizes a health care surrogate to be an authorized representative to assist a patient with a medicaid application, redetermination of

eligibility, and other related communications with the Department of

Human Services. (HB1812 HD1)
