<u>HB 1320, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR489)</u> Status RELATING TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION.

HED, JUD

Requires accredited and non-accredited post-secondary educational institutions that are for-profit entities to disclose in print and electronic media and signage that they are for-profit businesses registered in the

State. (HB1320 HD1)

<u>HB 2176, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR76-18</u>) <u>Status</u> RELATING TO EDUCATION.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Bars judicial review of Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' decisions on protests to the award of procurement contracts for student transportation or education facility construction. Requires parties who protest the award of a contract to pay attorney fees and costs resulting from the delay of the contract if the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs upholds the Chief Procurement Officer's decision denying the protest. (HB2176 HD1)

HB 1656 Status RELATING TO VIOLATIONS OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE LAW. Increases the amount of the fine that may be assessed against a noncandidate committee making only independent expenditures for campaign spending violations. Allows the Campaign Spending Commission to order that a fine assessed against a noncandidate committee, or any portion thereof, be paid from the personal funds of officers of the noncandidate committee.

Creates an eviction process for the Hawaii Public Housing Authority's

state low-income housing and state housing for elders programs.
