SB 2346, SD2 RELATING TO ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY. JUD, FIN (SSCR2925) Establishes the address confidentiality program within the Department of the Attorney General to help survivors of domestic abuse, sexual **Status** assault, and stalking to relocate and keep the location of their physical address confidential. Makes an appropriation to the Department of the Attorney General that is effective 7/1/2049. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) SB 2612, SD1 RELATING TO LIQUOR LICENSES. JUD, FIN (SSCR2585) Enables a social club granted tax exempt status pursuant to section Status 501(c)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code to sell wine from the social club's inventory to the club's members for off-premises consumption under the class 10 liquor license. Waives fees and other requirements for applicants for a class 10 liquor license. Specifies that the class 10 special liquor license includes the ability to auction off, at a live or silent auction, liquor in sealed or covered containers or services that provide liquor. (SD1) RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. JUD, FIN <u>SB 2613</u> (SSCR2557) Authorizes the liquor commission to issue a new restaurant liquor Status license prior to the restaurant commencing operation. Requires an applicant for a new class 2 restaurant liquor license to include a certification that the applicant intends and shall derive no less than thirty per cent of the establishment's gross revenue from the sale of foods. Clarifies that a class 2 restaurant liquor license is transferrable, provided that the transferee certifies that the transferee intends and shall derive no less than thirty per cent of the establishment's gross revenue from the sale of foods. RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC SB 2092, SD1 JUD, FIN (SSCR2757) ADMINISTRATION. Status Adds knowingly making a false statement to a county inspector a crime within the offense of unsworn falsification to authorities. Effective 7/1/2035. (SD1) RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS. SB 2662, SD2, HD1 HHS, JUD, FIN (HSCR1199-18) Codifies sustainable development goals based on Goal 1, no poverty, and Goal 3, good health and well-being, of the United Nations' Global Status Goals in the Hawaii State Planning Act. (SB2662 HD1) SB 2665, SD1, HD1 RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS. EDN, JUD, FIN (HSCR1171-18) Codifies in state law the goal relating to quality education of the Status United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and Indicators. (SB2665 HD1) SB 2666, SD2 RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS. JUD, FIN (SSCR2775) Codifies sustainable development goals based on the United Nations' Global Goal five, gender equality. (SD2) <u>Status</u> RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS. SB 2678, SD3, HD1 EDB, JUD, FIN (HSCR1155-18) Codifies Sustainable Development Goals 9, 10, 16, and 17 based on the United Nations' Sustainability Development Guidelines and **Status**

indicators. (SB2678 HD1)

SB 2343, SD2 (SSCR2749) Status

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

JUD, FIN

Amends the offense of abuse of family or household members to provide for felony, misdemeanor, and petty misdemeanor penalties. Expands the family court's jurisdiction over cases involving harassment of a family or household member. Allows the granting of a deferred acceptance of guilty or no contest plea in cases involving misdemeanor abuse of a family or household member in the second degree. Requires that no-contact and stay-away orders issued in criminal cases involving abuse of a family or household member or non-physical forms of harassment of a family or household member be converted by the court to a new protective order that shall remain in effect for a fixed reasonable period as the court deems appropriate, unless the victim or witness requests otherwise; provided that a hearing on the issue is held and certain requirements are met. Takes effect on 1/1/2050. (SD2)

STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES.

Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees. (SD1)
