<u>HB 1854</u>

### RELATING TO LOBBYISTS.

LAB, JUD, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Amends the lobbyists law to eliminate outdated references to criminal violations and to clarify that the State Ethics Commission may require payment of an administrative fine or restitution pursuant to a

settlement agreement.

HB 1855 Status

### RELATING TO ETHICS.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Empowers the State Ethics Commission to require the payment of restitution for ethics violations after a hearing or agreement between the parties.

<u>HB 1647</u>

#### RELATING TO HEALTH.

LAB, HHS, FIN

Status

Requires DHS to compile information regarding employers with employees who receive public assistance. Requires DHS to submit an annual report to legislature on the 50 employers with the highest number of employees receiving public assistance. Requires DLIR to

share employment data.

HB 1651 Status

## RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, HED, FIN

Establishes a collective bargaining unit for graduate student assistants employed by the University of Hawaii.

HB 1724 <u>Status</u>

#### RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Expands the poster requirement to massage therapy establishments that employ three or more people. Increases the penalties for violations of the poster requirement and deposits the penalties in the human trafficking victim services fund. Allows the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to contract with any state or county department or

agency for implementation or enforcement.

HB 1778 <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION MEDICAL BENEFITS.

LAB, CPC, FIN

Improves access for firefighters to comprehensive medical benefits upon diagnosis of cancer that is presumed to arise out of and in the

course of employment.

HB 1878

RELATING TO ELECTRICIANS.

LAB, IAC, CPC

**Status** 

Clarifies that employees performing high voltage electrical work for electrical contractors licensed under Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, are exempt from Chapter 448E, Hawaii Revised Statutes under certain conditions.

HB 1880 Status

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS.

LAB, IAC, CPC

Extends the sunset date of the limited exemption from licensing requirements for electrical contractors retained by an electric utility to work with high voltage and who are deemed qualified by the electric utility.

#### **DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW**
