Clarifies that a civil liability exemption for providing emergency access during a disaster applies to facilities receiving compensation and to owners who sell commodities to people seeking emergency access shelter on the owner's property; provided that the owner does

not engage in price gouging.

HB 2673

RELATING TO EMERGENCIES.

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<u>Status</u>

Prohibits places of public accommodation from denying shelter to any

person when the State, or any portion thereof, is the subject of an emergency alert that advises the public to immediately seek shelter. Provides for an unspecified civil penalty for each violation. Provides

immunity from civil liability, with certain exceptions.

HB 2693

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PBS/VMI, JUD,

Status

Requires businesses and homeowners to provide shelter upon missile threat alert. Provides immunity to businesses and homeowners.

Requires the Hawaii Advisory Council on Emergency management to develop a plan for emergency and disaster response. Requires

legislative report. Appropriates moneys.
