Establishes a new agricultural enterprise program within the department of agriculture to plan, design, construct, operate, manage, maintain, repair, demolish, and remove infrastructure on any lands under the jurisdiction of the department, to support and promote agriculture. Creates two new positions to implement the program. Establishes the agricultural enterprise special fund. Makes an appropriation. Takes effect 7/1/2025.

RELATING TO FOOD SUSTAINABILITY.

RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX.

Exempts gross receipts from the sale of mobility enhancing equipment, durable medical equipment, prosthetic devices, prescription drugs sold pursuant to a doctor's prescription, diabetic supplies, medical oxygen, and human blood and its derivatives from the general excise tax. Amends the definition of "prosthetic device" to include devices worn on the body.

RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGY.

Establishes licensure requirements for school psychologists to be administered by the board of psychology. Requires all school psychologists, including school psychologists employed by the department of education, to be licensed by 7/1/2021. Amends the composition of the board to include two school

Encourages disclosure of contracts between insurers and third party administrators to potential insureds and the insurance commissioner. Governs the qualifications and procedures for the licensing of third party administrators. Effective 1/1/2019. (SD1)

RELATING TO PAYDAY LENDING.

Transitions from lump sum deferred deposit transactions to installment-based small dollar loan transactions. Specifies various consumer protection requirements for small dollar loans. Beginning January 1, 2019, requires licensure for small dollar lenders that offer small dollar loans to consumers. Specifies

licensing requirements for small dollar lenders. (SD1)

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Permits individual department of education schools and career pathways, academies, or programs operated within a department of education school, to engage in commercial enterprises, including the sale of goods produced by or for an

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Requires the City and County of Honolulu to transfer to the Department of Education all property upon which a public elementary or intermediate school is situated. Gives the Department of Education power to acquire and hold title to real, personal, or mixed property for use for public educational

purposes. Requires legislative approval prior to the sale or gift of lands to which the Department of Education holds title. (SD1)

RELATING TO SCHOOL CLOSURES.

Allows school principals to close the school due to natural disaster if conditions are deemed unsafe for students and faculty without needing to consult the complex area superintendent in

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Requires the department of education to create a comprehensive plan to establish alternative learning centers in each school complex area in the State. Requires the department of education to submit the plan to the legislature

prior to the regular session of 2019.

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Requires the department of education to ensure that all classroom doors have interior locks installed by January 1, 2019, and intercom systems installed by January 1, 2020. Mandates that all schools have emergency management plans that are updated yearly and include annual mandatory emergency preparedness orientations and training. Requires emergency preparedness training for all teachers and school staff as well as emergency practice drills at every school, some of which must be during inopportune times of the school day.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD. Increases membership on the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board to include the chairperson of the Native Hawaiian Education Council and a non-voting public university student teacher. Clarifies that a permit is required for non-licensed teachers serving in public schools. (SD1)

RELATING TO ON-SITE EARLY CHILDHOOD FACILITIES. Establishes an income tax credit for employers who create onsite early childhood facilities. Establishes and appropriates funds for one on-site early childhood facility coordinator position. Applies to taxable years after 12/31/2018. Effective 7/1/2019.

RELATING TO TOURISM.

Renames the convention center enterprise special fund as the convention center operations and maintenance special fund and repeals the allocation of TAT revenues to that fund, and amends the allowable uses of that fund. Defines administrative expenses as used in section 201B-11(c), HRS, as office equipment, salaries, and supplies. Redistributes transient accommodations tax revenue from the Hawaii tourism authority to different state agencies for certain purposes. (SD1)

RELATING TO TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS TAX.

Clarifies that the transient accommodations tax shall be calculated based on the gross rental. Applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2018. (SD1)
