Clarifies that Act 159 does not apply to any rights, duties, or obligations that were extended by the Corporation through contract or preliminary offering statement prior to Act 159's effective date. Changes the annual contribution and deduction amounts, aggregate contribution amount, and deadline for distributing the entire interest for individual housing accounts established after December 31, 2018; allows Community Development Financial Institutions to serve as trustees of individual housing accounts established after December 31, 2018; and requires homebuyer education as a condition of distribution of funds in individual housing accounts by trustees. Takes effect on 01/01/2050.

HB 1716, HD1 (SSCR2990) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO A YOUTH COMMISSION. Establishes a youth commission within the Office of Youth Services to advise the Governor and Legislature on the effects of legislative policies, needs, assessments, priorities, programs, and budgets relating to youth. Appropriates funds. (HB1716 HD1)	HMS, WAM
(SSCR2988) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes the Health Analytics Program in the Med-QUEST Division of the Department of Human Services and authorizes the Department of Human Services to maintain an all-payers medical claims database. (HB694 HD2)	HMS, WAM
(SSCR2989) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. Requires the Department of Human Services to use an integrated and multigenerational approach to delivering human services to reduce the incidence of intergenerational poverty and dependence on public benefits. (HB1926 HD1)	HMS, WAM

Requires DHS to compile information regarding employers with employees who receive public assistance. Requires DHS to submit an annual report to legislature on the 50 employers with the highest number of employees receiving public assistance. Requires DLIR to share employment data. (HB1647 HD2)	HMS/LBR, WAM
HB 2144, HD1 (SSCR3020) Status & Testimony	RELATED TO MEDICAID. Requires the Department of Public Safety to inform inmates of the availability of assistance to secure or verify applicable medicaid eligibility prior to an inmate's release. (HB2144 HD1)	PSM/HMS, WAM
HB 1570, HD1 (HSCR869) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. Requires lessors of rental motor vehicles to include an option for the lessee in the motor vehicle rental agreement to contribute a sum to DLNR for the preservation and protection of the environment, commencing on January 1, 2020. (HB1570 HD1)	WAM [Measure deleted on 04-05-18]
