Authorizes an individual to care for up to 3 children, unrelated to the caregiver, without being subject to child care requirements. Removes requirement that family child care homes obtain insurance. Authorizes family child care homes to care for up to 10 children. Authorizes group child care homes to care for up to 16 children. Provides a tax credit for county real property taxes paid for portions of homes used exclusively for group child care

homes.

HB1680 RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT. TRN/HSG, EEP, Prohibits a county with a population greater than 500,000 from FIN

Prohibits a county with a population greater than 500,000 from establishing a transit-oriented development zone that extends more than 1 mile from a rail transit station included in a completed environmental impact statement. Prohibits the Office of Planning and the Hawaii Interagency Council for Transit-Oriented Development from advocating for, or facilitating the establishment of, a transit-oriented development zone that does

not meet those criteria.

HB1681 RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE. JUD

Specifies that a charging instrument containing the applicable criteria under section 706-662, HRS, for an extended term of imprisonment is sufficient to fulfill the notice requirement of

section 706-664(2), HRS.

Prohibits the use, sale, and distribution of sunscreens and personal care products that contain oxybenzone or octinoxate.

HB1718 RELATING TO TAXATION.

HHS, FIN

Provides a nonrefundable tax credit for eligible taxpayers for child care costs for children up to four years of age.

HB1719 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PBS, JUD, FIN

Requires the return of all out-of-state inmates by 12/31/20 if adequate bed space exists in Hawaii's prisons and correctional facilities. Provides that no more than 500 Hawaii inmates shall be detained in out-of-state prisons by 12/31/19. Requires the Department of Public Safety to plan, design, and construct sufficient facilities to house inmates in Hawaii and to pursue alternatives to incarceration for returning inmates. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds.

HB1720 RELATING TO TAXATION.

EDN, FIN

Allows for a state income tax deduction for teacher supplies purchased related to the classroom. Increases the franchise tax on banks and other financial corporations.

HB1721 RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

LAB, HHS, FIN

Includes persons with disabilities under the minimum wage requirements.

RELATING TO CESSPOOLS. HB1722

OMH, EEP/WAL,

Establishes a grant program and special fund to assist FIN

beneficiaries on Hawaiian home lands with cesspool upgrade or conversion costs. Establishes that a recipient of a cesspool upgrade grant shall not be eligible for the cesspool upgrade, conversion, or connection income tax credit. Appropriates

moneys for the grant program.

RELATING TO MARINE LIFE PROTECTION. HB1723

OMH, FIN

Establishes a working group to identify high priority areas that are in need of marine protection management for potential designation as marine protected areas.

<u>HB1724</u> RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Expands the poster requirement to massage therapy establishments that employ three or more people. Increases the penalties for violations of the poster requirement and deposits the penalties in the human trafficking victim services fund. Allows the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to contract with any state or county department or agency for implementation or enforcement.

HB1725 RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LAB, FIN

Requires collective bargaining public employees to provide written notification to the employee's exclusive representative to discontinue the employee's payroll assignments within a certain time period. Requires the employee's exclusive representative to provide a copy of the notification to the employer within seven business days of receipt from the employee.

HB1726 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

LAB, FIN

Appropriates funds for fiscal biennium 2017-2019 for collective bargaining cost items, salary increases, and other cost adjustments for public employees in collective bargaining unit (14) and for their excluded counterparts.

HB1727 RELATING TO LABOR.

LAB, FIN

Requires employers to provide a minimum amount of paid sick leave to employees to be used to care for themselves or a family member who is ill or needs medical care.

<u>HB1728</u> RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS.

PBS, EDN, FIN

Requires each public school to develop a disaster and attack preparedness plan by 9/1/2018 that includes shelter-in-place drills. Requires each school to maintain emergency goods sufficient for at least 48 hours in its facilities. Appropriates funds for emergency goods.

HB1729 RELATING TO FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENTS.

LMG, FIN

Requires the office of the legislative analyst to create fiscal impact statements for certain bills that have a fiscal impact. Makes an appropriation to the office of the legislative analyst.

Committee REFERRAL

HB1730 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT TRANSPARENCY. FIN

Clarifies that agencies must provide public disclosure of budget documents. Clarifies that exceptions to disclosure do not apply to budget documents unless agency can show a legitimate public safety justification for nondisclosure.

HB1731 PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION JUD, FIN

15, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO ENACT A

SUPERMAJORITY VOTING REQUIREMENT FOR PASSAGE OF LEGISLATION PROPOSING TO RAISE OR

CREATE TAXES.

Proposes a constitutional amendment to include a two-thirds supermajority voting requirement for the legislature to pass laws

that raise taxes or create new taxes.

HB1732 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX EXEMPTIONS. FIN

Provides an exemption for food and medical services from the

general excise tax.
