| <u>SB36, SD2</u> | RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION. Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs to regulate all channel designations and relocation of public, educational, and governmental access channels unless expressly prohibited by federal law. Allows cable operators to relocate or change the designation of public, educational, and governmental access channels only under certain conditions. (SD2) | IAC, CPC, FIN |
| <u>SB48, SD3</u> | RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY. Appropriates moneys to the Hawaii Technology Development Corporation for its continued operation. Requests that the Department of Accounting and General Services locate a site to which the Corporation may relocate. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD3) | EDB, HED, FIN |
| <u>SB80, SD2</u> | RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Makes an emergency appropriation to finance the relocation of transmission facilities for the "I Heart Radio" aerial. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | TRN, FIN |

| SB101, SD1 | RELATING TO STATE FUNDS. Requires that any contributions paid on behalf of a civil service or exempt status employee who is funded under special fund revenues and whose contributions are paid to the employees' retirement system of the State shall be paid from the respective special fund. | SB192, SD1 | RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET. Amends descriptions of capital improvement projects related to Live Stock Feed Mill and Waste Stream Recycling Facility in the General Appropriations Act of 2015, as amended by the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2016 and the General Appropriations Act of 2017. (SD1) | FIN |
| SB208, SD2 | RELATING TO UNCLAIMED LIFE INSURANCE BENEFITS. Adopts the National Conference of Insurance Legislators' Model Unclaimed Life Insurance Benefits Act, which requires life insurers to conduct database searches using the federal Social Security Administration's death master file or similar database to determine whether an insured has died. Requires life insurers to use good faith efforts to locate any beneficiaries to a policy, contract, or retained asset account. Authorizes the insurance commissioner to use discretion to limit, exempt, or phase-in compliance with requirements under certain circumstances. Effective 1/1/2019. (SD2) | CPC, FIN |
| SB222, SD2 | RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. Exempts gross receipts from the sale of mobility enhancing equipment, durable medical equipment, prosthetic devices, prescription drugs sold pursuant to a doctor's prescription, diabetic supplies, medical oxygen, and human blood and its derivatives from the general excise tax. Amends the definition of "prosthetic device" to include devices worn on the body. Amends the definition of "prescription drugs". Effective 1/1/2019. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2018. (SD2) | HHS, FIN |
| SB229, SD1 | RELATING TO VECTOR CONTROL. Appropriates moneys for 12 permanent full-time equivalent positions in the vector control branch of the Department of Health. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | HHS, FIN |

| <u>SB318, SD2</u> | <p>RELATING TO EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES. Allows home-schooled students to participate in extracurricular activities offered at the public school that they would otherwise be required to attend. Establishes a task force to determine criteria for prioritizing students who attend a public school over home-schooled students when determining which students may participate in an extracurricular activity. | <u>SB351, SD2</u> | <p>RELATING TO THE AHA MOKU ADVISORY COMMITTEE. Amends various provisions related to the aha moku advisory committee, including budgetary requirements. | <u>SB481, SD2</u> | <p>RELATING TO IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS. Adds the definition of "landowner" to the provisions relating to the identification and designation of important agricultural lands. (SD2)</p> | WAL, FIN |
| <u>SB508, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO TAXATION. Increases the taxes withheld on the amount realized by nonresidents from the disposition of Hawaii real property from 5% to 9%. Applies to real estate dispositions that occur on or after 9/15/2018. (SD1)</p> | FIN |
| <u>SB641, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION. Adds the chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission or the chairperson's designee to serve as an ex officio, voting member of the Commission on Water Resource Management. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p> | OMH/WAL, FIN |
| <u>SB738, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONERS. Expands the pool of orthodontists who are eligible to perform medically necessary orthodontic services for treatment of certain orofacial anomalies for which health insurance coverage is mandatory. (SD1)</p> | HHS, CPC, FIN |

| <u>SB1208, SD2</u> | RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Twin Bridge Farms, Inc., to purchase certain lands. (SD2) | AGR, FIN |
| <u>SB1235, SD2</u> | RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds to improve the health care services related to cardiac care at Hilo Medical Center. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | HHS, FIN |
| <u>SB1293, SD2</u> | RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Transfers the Corrections Population Management Commission from the Department of Public Safety to the Judiciary. Replaces the Director of Public Safety with the Chief Justice as a member of the Commission. Requires the Commission to meet at least once per quarter. Repeals provisions requiring as commission members: an individual who is knowledgeable on issues pertaining to reintegrating offenders into the community; and a judge. Adds as members: a substance abuse or mental health expert; and an advocate for incarcerated individuals. Requires the Department of Public Safety to provide commission members with access to internal information and the authority to conduct spot checks on correctional centers and facilities. Defines multiburst trigger activator as a device that simulates automatic gunfire by allowing standard function of a semiautomatic firearm with a static positioned trigger finger or a device that fires multiple shots with the pull and release of a trigger; or a manual or power-driven trigger activating device constructed and designed so that when attached to a semiautomatic firearm it simulates automatic gunfire. | <u>SB2050, SD2</u> | <p>RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Requires the department of human services to implement an earned income disregard program as an intermediate step to implementing a medicaid buy-in program. Requires reports to the legislature. Takes effect upon approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p> | HHS, FIN |
| <u>SB2051, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO EDUCATION. Permits individual department of education schools and career pathways, academies, or programs operated within a department of education school, to engage in commercial enterprises, including the sale of goods produced by or for an individual school, career pathway, academy, or program. (SD1)</p> | EDN, FIN |
| <u>SB2053, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO ATHLETIC TRAINERS. Makes permanent the regulation of athletic trainers. (SD1)</p> | IAC, CPC, FIN |
| <u>SB2056, SD2</u> | <p>RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires restaurants that sell children's meals that include a beverage for a single price to make the default beverage a healthy beverage. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)</p> | HHS, CPC, FIN |

| SB2058 | RELATING TO PRIVATE DETECTIVES AND GUARDS. Prohibits private detectives and guards from self-identifying as law enforcement officers, police, or police officers and from wearing or using any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement capable of being associated with that of a law enforcement officer employed by a government law enforcement organization. Requires review and approval of any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement to be used by private detectives or guards by the board of private detectives and guards. | IAC/PBS, CPC |
| SB2059, SD1 | RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY. Specifies who may be granted a temporary permit to practice public accountancy. Specifies the requirements that must be met prior to obtaining a temporary permit to practice. Requires a person to obtain a temporary permit to practice from the board of public accountancy prior to commencing public accountancy services in Hawaii. Specifies a time frame for the temporary permit to practice. Requires persons granted a temporary permit to practice to consent to and certify various obligations, including being under the authority of the board of public accountancy and paying all applicable taxes to the State. Makes conforming amendments to the laws relating to public accountancy. Takes effect on 1/1/2019. (SD1) | CPC, FIN |
| SB2060, SD2 | RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Expands the scope of the condominium education trust fund to cover voluntary binding arbitration between interested parties. | SB2069, SD1 | RELATING TO ‘ULU. Appropriates funds for the research, development, marketing, and conservation of ‘ulu. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | AGR/HED, FIN |
| SB2070, SD2 | RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires the Department of Education to convene an advisory committee to make recommendations on best practices for purposes of developing and implementing a plan to teach digital citizenship and media literacy in grades kindergarten through twelve in public schools, including charter schools and Hawaiian language immersion schools. Requires the Department of Education to develop the plan. Requires an annual report to Legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | EDN, FIN |

| <u>SB2077, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO WILDLIFE. Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to enter into the interstate wildlife violator compact or similar agreement for mutual assistance in the enforcement of wildlife laws. Takes effect on 07/01/2050. (SD1)</p> | WAL, JUD, FIN |
| <u>SB2078, SD1</u> | <p>RELATING TO PUEO RESEARCH. Appropriates funds for the department of land and natural resources to conduct, in collaboration with the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources, a two-year breeding ecology study and two-year foraging ecology study on the pueo on Oahu. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p> | WAL/HED, FIN |
| <u>SB2079, SD2</u> | <p>RELATED TO SHARK AND RAY PROTECTION. Establishes penalties and fines for any person who knowingly captures, takes, possesses, abuses, or entangles any shark, whether alive or dead, or kills any shark, within state marine waters and makes it a misdemeanor. Expands the existing prohibition on knowingly capturing or killing a manta ray to all rays. Expands the prohibition regarding rays to cover knowingly capturing, taking, possessing, abusing, or entangling a ray, whether alive or dead, or killing a ray, within state marine waters. Requires pharmacy benefit managers to disclose where an equivalent drug can be obtained at or below the maximum allowable cost when a maximum allowable cost is upheld on appeal. Allows contracting pharmacies to reverse and rebill claims if the pharmacy benefit manager establishes a maximum allowable cost that is denied on appeal and is required to pay the difference to the contracting pharmacies.
