WILLIAM CHAPMAN, FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2022**

The Department of Land and Natural Resources supports Governor's Message 657, nominating Dr. William Chapman to the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board expiring June 30, 2022.

The Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board (Board) is established under Section 6E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Board orders and enters historic properties into the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places and evaluates and recommends nominations to the National Register of Historic Places.

Dr. Chapman obtained a Doctorate of Philosophy in Anthropology from the University of Oxford, a Masters of Science in Historic Preservation from Columbia University, a Masters of Studies in Anthropology from the University of Oxford, and a Bachelors of Arts in Anthropology from the University of Virginia. Dr. Chapman is currently a Professor and Director of the Historic Preservation Graduate Program at the University of Hawaii at Mānoa. Dr. Chapman previously worked as an architectural historian for the Division of Archaeology and Historic Preservation at the Virgin Islands Planning Office, as well as a historian for the National Park Service.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Dr. Chapman's valuable knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board until June 30, 2022.
