Re: H.B. 1328, H.D. 1, Relating to Film and Digital Media Industry Development

The Department of Taxation (Department) provides the following comments regarding H.B. 1328, H.D. 1, for your consideration.

H.B. 1328, H.D. 1, amends Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) section 235-17, the statutory authority for the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit (film credit), as amended by Act 143, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017 (Act 143).

Specifically, the bill amends the aggregate cap amount from \$35 million per year to an unspecified amount and adds additional requirements to qualify for the film credit. H.D. 1 has a defective effective date of July 1, 2112.

First, the Department notes that Act 143 applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2018 and amended the film credit by:

- Extending the sunset date of the film credit from January 1, 2019 to January 1, 2026;
- Adding a requirement to provide evidence when claiming products or services acquired
  outside of the State that reasonable efforts were made to secure and use comparable
  products or services within the State;
- Limiting the total film credit to \$35 million per year, provided that if the total amount of credits applied for in any year exceeds the aggregate amount, the excess will be treated as having been applied for in the subsequent year and must be claimed in such year. No excess film credit can be claimed after December 31, 2025;
- Requiring all qualified production companies to obtain a verification review by a qualified certified public accountant (CPA) using procedures prescribed by DBEDT to be submitted with the statement of qualified production costs beginning January 1, 2019

(section 235-17(h), HRS);

- Requiring each qualified production company with production expenditures of \$1 million or more to obtain an independent third-party certification of qualified production costs eligible for the film credit in the form of a tax opinion beginning no later than January 1, 2018 (Section 6); and
- Requiring DBEDT in collaboration with the Department to submit to the Governor and Legislature an annual report on the number of jobs created in the State by the film productions receiving the film credit beginning January 1, 2018.

Second, the Department suggests resolving the conflict between section 235-17(h), and Section 6 of Act 143. Both provisions contain similar requirements for production companies to obtain an independent third-party review of qualified production costs, but the specific requirements cannot be reconciled as currently written. The Department suggests resolving this conflict by combining the separate provisions in section 235-17(h). The Committee may also want to consider allowing other professionals, such as tax attorneys, provide third-party verification of the qualified production costs.

When a show comes in from the Mainland to shoot here, many people from many different crafts of the film industry are hired to fill positions from Dept Heads to Day Laborers. Every department ships supplies by sea and by air. Every department requires many things they do not bring with them. I have personally been responsible for buying everything from props to set dressing, clothing and accessories. Offices buy supplies, caterers buy food, craft service buys food, carpenters buy every possible supply to build sets. Drivers rent trucks and vans and buy gas. It goes on from the minute shows get here until even after they leave as we wrap out and ship supplies back. Every worker from here makes a living wage that allows them to buy and invest in Hawali. It seems like giving back a tax credit for bringing in so much work is the least we can do. There are a lot of other American and foreign destinations waiting for this work if we don't get it.

In 1996, I moved to Hawaii to raise my family. Since then, I have opened several companies, Liquid Planet Studios, 4 Miles LLC and Carrillo Digital, Inc. I am fortunate to have worked with hundreds of clients on thousands of shoots in 11 different countries, but I would much rather work at home and be home with my family. Hawaii's Film Tax Credit has allowed me to do that. I have worked on large shows such as "Hawaii Five-O," "The Amazing Race," "Off the Map," as well as Hawaii-based shows like "The Merrie Monarch" and the "Na Hoku Hano Hano Awards." I excel at Hawaiian documentaries, and I have employed and trained many workers in Hawaii's film industry.

If the cap is implemented, there will be fewer jobs. Luckily, I am able to travel to where the work is - most of my colleagues won't be able to do that. Working abroad would require that I be away from my family. My youngest son, who is a teenager now, will likely miss me the most, and I will not be here to film the stories of Hawaii that are meaningful to me.


When the committee discusses the implementation of the cap, please think about how individual lives will be adversely affected and try your best to work with our industry to find the best solution.




#### Comments:

Dear Chair Wakai, Vice Chair Taniguchi and members of the committee:

The Honolulu Film Office **supports HB1328, HD1** and respectfully requests that it be reported out to the Ways and Means committee so that important discussions regarding the impact and implementation of the cap included last session can continue.

The extension of the sunset date last session was critical to the longevity of the program. The film industry greatly appreciates the actions that the Legislature took in 2017 to extend the credit; however an inclusion of an overall rebate ceiling was added which, after careful DBEDT and industry analysis, has revealed some unintended consequences that put the strong success of the program in jeopardy.

The overall industry cap has created some negative dynamics in the program. We understand and appreciate the fiscal challenges before the Legislature but also are concerned that a very successful program from an economic development perspective will be compromised. In calendar year 2017 the direct spend into Hawaii's economy was \$320 million which fueled the following overall economic impacts (per CID/DBEDT /READ 2/14/18):

2017 Film Industry Total Economic Impacts:

Total economic output:

\$553 million

Total earnings:

\$128 million \$35.2 million

State tax revenues: Total job impacts:

3,392

The industry is working with DBEDT and DoTAX to address this and other concerns. More time is needed to do so properly and not negatively affect a successful program so we are respectfully requesting that the enactment date of Act 143 set for 2019 be extended to 2020.

The Honolulu Film Office would like to thank the Legislature for its long-standing support of Hawaii's film industry. Working together we will be able to continue to grow this important sector. Thank you for the opportunity to provide this testimony.
