Chair Creagan, Vice Chair DeCoite, and members of the Committee on Agriculture:

The Land Use Commission while supporting the general intent, is opposed to this measure as currently written, which seeks to amend section 205-2(a)(13), Hawai`i Revised Statutes (HRS) to allow overnight campgrounds on private property and direct the counties to adopt interim rules or ordinances to regulate such uses.

While the measure would seem to be aimed at accommodating tourism activities, the Commission is concerned about the potential for other unintended uses to fall within its definition. The measure would allow long-term camping on private land which could lead to established encampments in violation of health, safety and environmental laws. Significantly, it could be used to justify homeless encampments. The Commission already has before it a case requesting approval to create a long-term, private homeless encampment in Maui County.

Chair Creagan, Vice Chair DeCoite, and Members of the House Committee on Agriculture.

The Office of Planning (OP) provides comments on HB 1477 which amends Section 205-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) by amending subsection (d) (13) Open Area recreational facilities, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to include overnight campgrounds on private property.

A major objective of HRS Chapter 205 is to protect agricultural lands and ensure their continued availability for agricultural use. Currently overnight campgrounds are not permitted on any Agricultural lands without a State Special Use Permit. Proposals larger than 15 acres must be approved by the State Land Use Commission (LUC). This bill would allow large campground operations to be established within the State Agricultural districts without LUC approval, and has the potential to proliferate large campground operations, which would reduce lands for Agricultural use. Allowing non-agricultural uses in the State Agricultural District may contribute to the impermanence syndrome, which is the accelerated agricultural decline near urban areas due to disinvestment in farming in anticipation of urban development.

The Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) **opposes** House Bill No. 1477, which would permit overnight campgrounds on land within the State Agricultural district.

While the Bill offers specific conditions on overnight camping, it disregards the agricultural productivity potential of the lands. To do so would continue to undermine the purpose of the State Agricultural District, which is to protect valued land for agricultural purposes. If the State Agricultural District must allow overnight camping, it should be on lands not essential to agriculture.

The City and County of Honolulu is in the midst of defining its Important Agricultural Lands (IAL), as required by the Hawaii Constitution and Chapter 205, HRS. We would ask that this Bill be deferred until the IAL has been officially adopted before further intrusion of non-agricultural uses be allowed in the State Agricultural District.

Aloha Chair Creagan, Vice Chair DeCoite, and Members of the Committee:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB opposes HB 1477, which permits private overnight campgrounds on land with an overall soil productivity rating of C, D, E, or U within agricultural districts.

HFB believes that the primary use of agriculturally zoned lands is production agriculture. Our policy states that we support:

"Directing nonagricultural uses and activities from agricultural lands to other areas and ensure that uses on agricultural lands are actual agricultural uses"

There is a wide array of permissible uses in the Agricultural District. Counties find enforcement difficult. Camping is clearly not an agricultural activity. We believe it should occur only under special conditions and require special use permits. Regardless how restrictive the intent of the measure, creative people will find loopholes and there will be unintended consequences.

Abuse and enforcement of these laws is usually the challenge and HFB is especially concerned about unintended consequences of allowing other types of activities on agriculture land. We believe the primary purpose within the Agricultural District is production agriculture.

Rather than increasing non-agricultural uses on agricultural lands, we suggest creating mechanisms to increase farm and ranch viability so farms and ranches will not need non-agricultural activities to supplement their incomes.
