#### RELATING TO FILIPINO VETERANS BURIAL ASSISTANCE

House Bill No. 1944, H.D. 1, establishes the Filipino-American Veterans of World War II Burial Assistance Program; establishes the Filipino-American Veterans of World War II Burial Assistance Program Special Fund; and provides an unspecified general fund and special fund appropriations. The measure further provides that the fund is to be administered by the Office of Veterans Services, into which shall be deposited appropriations by the Legislature, and for which funds shall be used for operating expenses of and burial grants provided by the burial assistance program.

While the Department of Budget and Finance does not take any position on the establishment of the Filipino-American Veterans of World War II Burial Assistance Program, as a matter of general policy, the department does not support the creation of special funds which do not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges



made upon the users or beneficiaries of the program or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. With regards to House Bill No. 1944, H.D. 1, it does not appear that the special fund meets the criteria of Section 37-52.3, HRS.


# Testimony in Support of HB 1944 Relating to Filipino Veterans Burial Assistance

Filipina Advocacy Network supports programs and policies that seek to equity for Filipinos and the status of Filipinos in Hawai'i. We strongly HB 1944 hd1 to provide stable funding for burial grants for qualifying Filipino-American veterans. These funds would pay for funeral and burial services and transportation of their remains to the Philippines; provided that federal funds remain unavailable and there remain eligible Filipino American veterans living in the State. The veterans living in our state do not have resources to transport their remains to the Philippines if that is their final wish. Although burial grants to cover this cost were statutorily established, there are no stable funds available. These veterans are in their 90's, most do not have family in Hawai'i and are low-income.
