In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1973 RELATING TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION

House Bill 1973 proposes to amend Section 205-12 (Enforcement), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to authorize the State Land Use Commission (LUC) to compel any public agency to perform any of the public agency's duties or responsibilities or to comply with any statutory requirements pertaining to the public agency within the Conservation District. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) opposes this measure.**

Section 183C-3(7) (Powers and duties of the board and department) HRS, identifies the Board of Land and Natural Resources and the Department as having the power to establish and enforce land use regulations on conservation district lands. This measure appears to give LUC power over the day to day regulation of conservation district land, without any explanation or rational.
