In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1977, HOUSE DRAFT 2 RELATING TO FLOOD MITIGATION

House Bill 1977, House Draft 2 proposes that the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency develop a strategic regional flood plan that shall address flood mitigation, flood water retention, flood diversion, and catastrophic floods, and report its progress back to the legislature. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) acknowledges the intent of this bill and offers the following comments and amendment.

The development of a strategic regional flood plan will require the participation of various County, State and Federal Agencies, and may also include participation from large private landowners. The Department suggests utilizing a working group comprised of the appropriate agencies and stakeholders that have authority or involvement in flood mitigation, flood water retention, flood diversion or flood preparation and recovery activities to develop a comprehensive report to the legislature.

The Department suggests revising SECTION 1 of this measure to read as follows:

SECTION 1. (a) The Hawaii emergency management agency shall [develop strategic regional flood plans that shall] facilitate a working group to address flood

[The plans shall become effective on December 31, 2020.]

- (b) The [agency] working group shall be comprised of representatives from the following county, state, and federal agencies:
 - (1) city and county of Honolulu;
 - (2) Hawaii county;
 - (3) Maui county;
 - (4) Kauai county;
 - (5) Hawaii emergency management agency;
 - (6) department of land and natural resources;
 - (7) department of transportation;
 - (8) office of planning;
 - (9) army corps of engineers;
 - (10) national oceanic and atmospheric administration;
 - (11) federal emergency management agency;
 - (12) natural resources conservation service;
 - (13) united states geological survey.
- (c) The Hawaii emergency management agency may invite other agencies, entities, or individuals to serve on the working group as they deem necessary.
- (d) The Hawaii emergency management agency shall submit to the legislature a written report of its progress [in developing plans], including any findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, no later than

twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of [2019.] 2020.

The Department also notes that funding will be needed to support the activities of such a working group.

On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i, a member of the Common Good Coalition, **supports HB 1977 HD2**, which requires the Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency to develop strategic regional flood plans, including plans to address flood mitigation, flood water retention, flood diversion, and catastrophic floods.

Climate change has already resulted in sea level rise and will likely increase the frequency and severity of floods. Development of climate change adaptation plans on a regional basis is a timely response to those threats.

As testimony from both the Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency and Department of Land and Natural Resources stress, developing regional flood plans will require involvement of state and county agencies and other stakeholders through information of a working group.
