#### In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1977 RELATING TO FLOOD MITIGATION

House Bill 1977 proposes that the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency develop a strategic regional flood plan that shall address flood mitigation, flood water retention, and flood diversion, and report findings back to the legislature. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources** (**Department**) acknowledges the intent of this bill and offers the following comments.

The development of a strategic regional flood plan will require the participation of various County, State and Federal Agencies, and may also include participation from large private landowners. The Department suggest utilizing a working group comprised of the appropriate agencies and stakeholders that have authority or involvement in flood mitigation, flood water retention, flood diversion or flood preparation and recovery activities to develop a comprehensive report to the legislature. The Department also notes that funding will be needed to support the activities of such a working group.

Aloha - I am Vern T. Miyagi, Administrator of Hawaii Emergency Management Agency. I am submitting the following comments regarding House Bill 1977. I sincerely appreciate the measure's recognition and focus on the importance of community resilience and preparedness regarding our water and other critical resources needed during a disaster, however HI-EMA does not have the planning resources or expertise to undertake such a major strategic regional flood plan. This new major task will conflict with our ongoing disaster planning projects related to the post disaster restoration of critical systems - airports and seaports, power, fuel, food, potable water, shelters, and medical.

Due to the strategic regional scope of this plan perhaps a working group of various state agencies, counties, and first responders may be a better option, than just HI-EMA.
