In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2197 RELATING TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION

House Bill 2197 proposes to (1) Authorize the Land Use Commission (LUC) to monitor and evaluate the enforcement of laws on conservation lands by the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department); and (2) Require the LUC to submit an annual report regarding the effectiveness of efforts by the Department to enforce laws regarding conservation land. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) opposes this measure.

Section 183C-3(7) (Powers and duties of the board and department) Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), identifies the Board of Land and Natural Resources and the Department as having the power to establish and enforce land use regulations on conservation district lands. Chapter 205, HRS, establishes the LUC to set boundaries for districts and classification of lands in Hawai'i. This measure appears to give the LUC the responsibility to monitor and evaluate the enforcement of laws on conservation lands by the Department, without any explanation or rational.
