I support the intent of this bill. But it should be amended to require that each school must keep a list of emergency items in its inventory which should be replaced at specific dates such as food, water, first-aid or medical supplies. The date for replacement of any particular item should be sufficiently far ahead of the expiration of its usefulness to allow the item to be sold or given to charities serving low-income or homeless people at a time when the item still has some remaining potency or usefulness. The bill should also include a recommendation that the state Department of Education should consult with U.S. military logistics personnel to get advice on the shelf life of emergency supplies and how to maintain good inventory control and timely give-away of items while some usefulness remains.
