- 1 Fiscal Implications: N/A.
- 2 **Department Testimony:** The Department of Health (DOH) strongly supports HB2493 HD2
- 3 and respectfully urges the Senate to pass unamended to expedite enactment. The department has
- 4 immediate needs that will benefit from enactment of this measure. In 2017, the Legislature
- 5 appropriated funds and authorized an epidemiologist to investigate potential lead exposure on
- 6 Kauai. The department is unable to recruit for this because of the arbitrary cap.
- 7 Epidemiologists are unique to public health. DOH deploys epidemiologists to effectively track
- 8 and characterize emergent disease outbreaks such as those caused by dengue, hepatitis A,
- 9 norovirus, or mumps by using various tools (e.g., GIS mapping, online survey tools) to analyze
- data to determine specific risks, identify potential or specific etiologic agents, or guide public
- 11 health interventions. Epidemiologists also analyze longer term trends, using environmental,
- health care, chronic disease, mental health, and substance abuse data including the injuries and
- deaths related to opioid misuse and abuse, to inform public policy and department operations.
