RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROMISE PROGRAM

House Bill No. 2501, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, establishes the Hawaii Community College Promise Program to provide scholarships for the unmet direct cost needs of qualified students enrolled at a community college; establishes the Hawaii Community College Promise Program Special Fund; appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for deposit to the special fund; and appropriates an unspecified amount of special funds.

As a matter of general policy, the department does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. With regards to House Bill No. 2501, H.D. 1, S.D, 1, the sources of revenues for the special fund are not specified, so it is difficult to determine if there is an appropriate nexus or if the special fund is financially self-sustaining.
