- 1 **Fiscal Implications:** Unspecified general fund appropriation to the Department of Health.
- 2 **Department Testimony:** The Department of Health acknowledges the value and interest in the
- 3 Tropic Care exercise, which brings much needed health care services to rural residents at no cost
- 4 to patients while assuring deployment readiness for the armed forces. In general, this exercise is
- 5 known as Innovate Readiness Training (IRT), and the Department of Health is grateful for the
- 6 interest of the Legislature in providing funds.
- 7 Tropic Care 2018 is scheduled for June 16-28 at Keaau High School, and the department
- 8 continues to work with the Hawaii County Council and other stakeholders to assure another
- 9 successful deployment. However, if enacted, the appropriations will take effect after completion
- of this year's IRT. The Big Island conducts an IRT's only every other year and has not
- submitted an application for 2019. The next exercise is planned for 2020, for which the
- application is due this September. The department will continue to work with the Legislature
- and Big Island delegation to assure the event's continuity.

My name Renee Manfredi. I am the President of the Hawaii Self Advocacy Advisory Council. We have nearly 200 members statewide.

Our members represent individuals with disabilities and we are in **strong support of HB2606 HD1**.

Tropic Care provides free services to rural districts on the island of Hawaii have included physical examinations, dental treatment, eye examinations, eyeglasses, medication review, provision of some medications, and nutritional education. The Tropic Care program has also provided free transportation so that individuals are able to access the free medical services. Many of the self advocates on the neighbor islands have received services from Tropic Care, especially dental treatment which medicaid no longer provides for adults. And eyeglasses, Medicaid provides annual eye exams but will only pay for one pair of glasses every two years.


