- 8 conversion of cesspools. HB2626 also establishes a cesspool conversion working group to assist
- 9 the third-party consultant on the study.

Aloha Chair Lee, Vice-Chair Lowen and Members of the Committee:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB strongly supports HCR 111, which request the Department of Health to convene regional cesspool modernization task forces in each County.

Cesspools are common in rural areas across the State. While cesspool impacts at shoreline areas are clear, the impacts in areas far from the ocean and at high elevations are less evident. Recent groundwater contamination findings in Upcountry Maui have raised concern about sites far from the ocean. It is clear that other sources of contamination than residential cesspools exist. For example, the land over one of the wells was irrigated with wastewater from the surrounding subdivision. Given the significant costs associated with retrofits, a better understanding of contamination sources and solutions is needed. It is not a one size fits all situation. This warrants the regional task forces as proposed in this measure.

The 2050 deadline and requirements as home renovations occur should also be addressed by the task force. Clarification of federal requirements is needed.

For these reasons HFB respectfully request your strong support of this measure.
