URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTAITON TO SUBMIT LEGISLATION FOR A UNIVERSAL HELMET LAW IN HAWAII REQUIRING ALL OPERATORS AND RIDERS OF MOTORCYCLES, MOTOR SCOOTERS, MOPEDS, AND BICYCLES TO WEAR SAFETY HELMETS.

House Committee on Transportation

The Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports** H.C.R. 53 that urges the DOT to submit legislation for a universal helmet law requiring all operators and riders of motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and bicycles to wear safety helmets.

The DOT supports requiring motorcycle, motor scooter and moped riders to wear U.S. Department of Transportation approved helmets, to wear the helmets according to the manufacturers requirements and requiring helmets for those who rent motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds and bicycles.

The DOT strongly believes requiring a universal helmet law will reduce injuries and fatalities among motorcycle, motor scooter, moped and bicycle riders of all ages and abilities.

The DOT will submit legislation for a universal helmet law in Hawaii during the 2019 legislative session.

"I OPPOSE THIS HCR 53"

FOR THE RECORD, no one is saying helmets don't provide safety benefits. They do. But, there is also evidence that there are safety risks. Unlike seat belts, there is little data on the effects of a helmeted body in motion from a bike crash.

Officials often state that helmet laws reduce accidents. A helmet cannot stop an accident. But... a helmet law **does** reduce riding. Per the DMV, California has 40% less bikes registered today then in 1992 when the state enacted its helmet law! And of those that continue to ride... they ride less often. The math: less bikers riding less often = less targets for cars to hit, which therefore = less accidents.

Instead of confusing the public with gross accident statistics that have no relation to the ability of a helmet to provide enough safety to even think about a mandate, many Officials don't quote, or even know, whether helmets have had an effect on **the ratio** of the number of deaths from head injury as related to the number of accidents. That is the stat you want to know!

Recently, a number of states have modified helmet laws to permit motorcyclists to ride without a helmet if they carry specific <u>health insurance</u> coverage or pass a rider training course. Other "partial" helmet-use laws, such as those requiring only certain age groups to use helmets, have unknown effectiveness because of enforcement issues. These approaches dilute the original reasons for the law and may raise confusion about the usefulness and role of helmets.

So why all the disinformation? Follow the money trail. The life insurance industry can't control their car drivers from hitting us, but they can control the number of targets their drivers can hit by backing helmet laws that reduce riding. This all dovetails nicely with the prejudice and propoganda against motorcycling.

We're seen as anti-social, public burdens, scofflaws, "scary", etc. instead of energy and road space efficient travelers that contribute millions of dollars to the economy and charities of every type. Take a recent Maryland "study", for example, that refers to

beanie helmets as "Nazi style". WOW! Then there's the ever present public mindset; since football players, astronauts and racers wear them, we're crazy not to. If only it were that simple.

Call ANY helmet manufacturer and see if you can get a straight answer whether their helmets cause neck injury or protect your head at speeds over 15 MPH. Try it...

Officials don't tell you how many neck injuries are caused by helmets. When air bags were found to hurt and kill children, NHTSA aggressively studied the situation and determined that they are, in fact, safe "if" used correctly, but that they can kill if not. As a result, <u>air bags are not mandatory</u> and can be disconnected legally. This begs the question, since there are cases where riders have sustained neck injury from their helmet, why isn't this being studied so that we can once and for all, ALL know the pros and cons of helmets. Like air bags, helmets should be a matter of freedom of choice.

The next time someone is in your face about helmets, quote Snell to them:

"A helmet that can take one of our headforms through these 2 impacts unscathed could probably handle a single impact somewhat greater than 17.3 MPH, but certainly no more than 23 MPH." - Snell

The best way to protect yourself is take an approved motorcycle safety course, maintain your bike, wear leathers, wear eyewear, ride responsibly and above all:

Don't Drink, Drug and Ride...

Comments:

Riding a motorcycle without a cranial cushion poses no danger to anyone except the rider. Skull fractures are not contagious. The public is not at risk if I decide to mount a Harley with nothing but a pinwheel hat on my head.

The mandatory helmet crowd, however, insists there is a threat to the public: the threat of being forced to cover the medical costs of bikers who are injured or disabled. Notes the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, "Only slightly more than half of motorcycle crash victims have private health insurance coverage. For patients without private insurance, a majority of medical costs are paid by the government."

Under the new health care law, of course, everyone will have to obtain coverage. But even then, the premiums of healthy people will have to cover the costs of motorcyclists' injuries.

The complaint has a point, but it considers only the costs of motorcycle accidents, not the—yes—benefits. At the risk of sounding macabre, let me note that a 50-year-old biker who dies in a wreck saves us money, since he won't be around to collect Social Security, Medicare, or Medicaid in his old age. A 20-year-old fatality may yield a harvest of excellent organs for patients awaiting transplants.

Besides, the argument on safety and medical costs is one that proves too much. Brain buckets reduce the chance of being killed in a wreck, but federal data indicate that most of those who die in motorcycle accidents would be killed even with a helmet. So it's safe to assume that most of those seriously injured would be laid up in the hospital either way.

The real danger is not from riding a motorcycle without a helmet, but from riding, period. If you crash a hog at 70 mph, your head is only one of the body parts that will come out much worse for wear. If we're justified in requiring helmets to save medical expenses, why not simply outlaw motorcycles entirely? That would prevent a lot more death and injury. Also, we need more time to educate law enforcement and general public about properly fitted helmets not all DOT helmets save lives they can actually cause more harm if not properly fitted.

It's also hard to see why we single out motorcyclists for the sin of saddling everyone with higher health care costs. Plenty of patients suffer from self-inflicted ailments—lung cancer from smoking, liver damage from drinking, diabetes from eating unhealthy foods, AIDS from unprotected sex. Yet we don't ban these activities.

Why not? Because we retain a respect for individual freedom and choice—even in matters of life and death, even when individual choices have collective costs. Motorcycle helmet laws are an unwarranted exception to our normal, sound approach, which can be summarized: It's your life, and it's your funeral. Individuals who don't ride should not be making laws for those who do.

We always knew how special she was, however not the complete magnitude until after horrific day. Alexis had three vigils; One in Las Vegas, one in San Diego and one at her High School Del Oro in Loomis, California.

Maui residents met us at Alexis's roadside memorial, prayed with us and mourned with us a couple days after and placed Hawaiian leis on us. Maui has some incredible locals that are maintaining her memorial and keeping in touch. There also have been several visitors, families and locals that have visited her site as well.

Her Celebration of Life was held at the Ridge Golf Course in Auburn, California where Alexis golfed with her team and Daddy several times and a full house in attendance. Alexis was part of the Civil Air Patrol and the Color Guard performed a special tribute. Alexis's Tae Kwon Do Instructors performed and presented us with Alexis's Black Belt. Three skydivers landed on the 18th hole, to pay homage to their fellow sister and a three plane "Missing Man" fly by.

Our family lineage ended with Alexis unfortunately.

We will do what we can on this end, but we implore all of you to come to an agreement on the need for HCR 53 to move forward today.

To the Members of Hawaii's Department of Transportation.

I write this letter and testimony as a family friend to Tim and Danielle Jenkins and Peymon Golafshan.

In August of 2017, Alexis Jenkins, Daughter of Tim and Danielle and girlfriend of Peymon, lost her life

on a motorized vehicle known as a "scooter" in the Wailea area of Maui. Her young precious life ended because

she was not to protected from the dangers of being an inexperienced and unprotected driver of a "scooter".

The current laws and requirements of Hawaii's visitors and residences allow them to easily obtain, rent, use and ride these

modes of transportation, but do not protect them from the harm and seriousness of injury and /or death from riding

these vehicles.

As a motorcycle rider for most of my adult life, I understand the motorcycle enthusiast' desire to have the freedom to ride

without a safety helmet. But for people who see a scooter or a moped as a "fun" "safe" "easy" form of transportation, they

don't know the reality of the fact that many visitors and residences alike throughout Hawaii are injured or die every year on our

roads and highways on one these.

The tragic and gruesome death of Alexis Jenkins not only seriously affected her boyfriend Peymon Golafshan who witnessed

her instantaneous demise as she hit with an oncoming truck, but also the driver and all of the occupants of the truck

that she hit. Then the first responders, the police, paramedics, tourist traveling on the roadway at the time, neighbors of the

accident scene. Then the negative impact that this has had on the Maui community at large. Then when this bad news finally

hit home with her parents, Tim and Danielle who hears that their only child has died within her first full day in Maui. Then when

this tragic news spreads to the thousands of people who knew Alexis, the pain of her death in Hawaii taints paradise to

all of the people negatively affected. Then all of us question whether there was anything that could have spared Alexis' life?

The only thing that could have changed it all, and we don't know for sure if it would have, but had Alexis been required by Hawaii

State law and the moped/scooter rental shop to wear a safety helmet, it may have made all of the difference in the world.

There have been other motor vehicle laws created to lower the risk of accidents, injuries and death such as prohibiting the use

of drugs and alcohol, cell phone texting and talking and the requirements of using seat belts and child restraint seats. These are

all excellent laws that were created for the good and safety of all people, but also created out of common sense whether or not all

of the people like them or not.

Hawaii lawmakers cannot create a law to protect visitors and residents alike from shark attacks, drowning, heart attacks or any

number of other life threatening events. But Hawaii lawmakers have it in their power right now to reduce the risk of injuries and death

to all of us who ride mopeds, scooters, motorcycles and bicycles, by initiating a safety helmet law whether or not all of the people

who ride these, like them or not.

The passing of Measure HCR 53 and the helmet safety requirements is not only past due for all of the people who lost their lives

and all of their family and friends who lost a loved one, but for all of the people in the future who may spared from the pain and suffering

that Alexis Jenkins' family and friends have had to endure since her passing.

We can't imagine anyone wanting to oppose a law that is common sense, basically good for the people and the right thing to do.

A law like this shows tremendous respect and concern for all and especially those who are visiting our paradise islands.

No one visiting our islands for vacation or business should leave the way that Alexis Jenkins did. We hope you will agree.
