In consideration of HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 238/HOUSE RESOLUTION 206 ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO COLLABORATIVELY WORK WITH COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO IDENTIFY AND ESTABLISH OFF-LEASH DOG PARKS ON THE WINDWARD SIDE OF OAHU.

House Concurrent Resolution 238/House Resolution 206 urges the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) and the Department of Parks and Recreation of the City and County of Honolulu to collaboratively work with community stakeholders to identify and establish off-leash dog parks on the windward side of Oahu. The Department provides the following comments.

While the Department supports increased opportunity for any form of managed public recreation, the function of identifying canine pet stakeholders and suitable dog park areas — is not a Departmental function.

The Department is willing to work with others where relevant with respect to inquiries regarding state lands over which it has jurisdiction. Beyond that, Department staff lack any experience in what constitutes a suitable dog park, and then establishing a park of this theme and function. This type of recreational activity, as is playgrounds and ball playing fields, have always been more appropriately a municipal function. At the Department's Division of State Parks, all dogs must be leashed or are prohibited by signage if warranted. That is the extent of experience staff have – it is in regulating the use on leash – very contra to how a dog park may function to match the pet owner's desired experience.
